

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) reports handling the following business:

-MCSO, Oregon State Police, Oregon Dept. of Transportation, Boardman Ambulance, Irrigon Rescue received a report of another vehicle accident on Highway 730. There were three people in the vehicle.
