

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) reports handling the following business:

-BPD received a 911 hang up call from a Boardman residence. Upon recontact, a female advised there was no emergency and hung up. MCSO received a FAX machine when the number was redialed.

-MCSO received report that a Buick was parked in the intersection of Hwy. 730 and SE 11th in Irrigon, unoccupied. MCSO attempted contact but was unable to locate the owner.

February 20: HPD received two 911 calls reporting of a flue fire at a residence in Heppner.

-MCSO received request for deputy response because a construction company near the caller's residence was tearing up the road.

-MCSO received request to assist Boardman PD with a subject. Officers were unable to locate the subject.

-MCSO received request that a juvenile subject be transported from Norcor in the Dalles to court at Irrigon Justice Court.

-BPD arrested Timothy Wayne Brooks, 26, on a Morrow County Circuit Court warrant for Parole Violation/Possession of a Controlled Substance-C Felony with no bail.
