

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) reports handling the following business:

-Heppner Fire Department, MCSO received report of a one vehicle motor vehicle accident on Hwy 207. It was a non-injury accident but the vehicle was blocking the roadway.
