

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) reports handling the following business:

-MCSO received a report from the Hermiston Police Dept. that Beth Diamond, 20, was arrested on a warrant for Failure to Pay Fine-MIP. Diamond was lodged at the Umatilla County Jail on a UCSO warrant with a hold for MCSO.
