

Heppner Junior High championship meet held at Umatilla

The Heppner Junior High track championship meet was held May 11 at Umatilla, with 10 schools participating.

Heppner eighth grade girls' team took first place with 161 points, over second place Columbia with 110 points.

The eighth grade boys' team captured fifth out of the 10 schools.

The seventh grade boys' team took fourth out of the 10 schools participating.

Results are as follows.

Eighth grade girls' team: Shanna Rietmann-100m hurdles second with 19.76, triple jump second with 30'4" (her personal best; she also set a new school record earlier in the year with 30'7"), 100m first and undefeated for the season with 13.31 (just shy of Stephanie Payne's school record of 13.19 set in 1981), 200m

first and undefeated for the season with 28.64; Cara Kennedy-high jump a tie for second and third with 4'7", 100m hurdles fifth with 20.52, 4x100r. second with 67.73 (just shy of school record of 57.69); Blair Keithley-4x100r. second with 57.73, 100m third with 14.26, 4x200r. first and undefeated all season with 2:01.67 (also set new school record, the old record was 2:09.34 set in 2000), discus fifth with 68'9"; Madison Bailey-discus second with 74'1", 4x100r. second with 57.69, 200m fourth with 30.54, 4x200r. first with 2:01.57 and a new school record; Jessica Wainwright-1500m third with 5:49.40 (her personal best), 800m fourth with 2:52.23; Linsey Mitchell-shot put first with 28'3" (new school record, old school record set by Pam Orr with 28'2" in 1981), 4x100r. second with 57.69, 400m second with 1:10.66, 4x200r.

first with 2:01.67; Chelsea Britt-high jump first with 4'8", 400m first and undefeated all season with 1:09.13, 200m third with 30.24, 4x200r. first with 2:01.67; Terra Wilson-high jump tie for second and third with 4'7", 400m third with 1:13.85.

Eighth grade boys' team: Brandon Seitz-300m hurdles sixth with 52.67, 100m hurdles third with 21.13; Kyle Huddleston-triple jump seventh with 28'9", 400m seventh with 1:05.18, 800m eighth with 2:47.43, 4x200r. third with 1:59.61; Tyler Boyer-100m fifth with 13.12, 200m seventh with 27.45, 4x200r. third with 1:59.61; Aaron Delveaux-shot put fifth with 34'1/2", 400m fourth with 1:01.75, 800m third with 2:26.72, 4x200r. third with 1:59.61; Robert McElligott-300m hurdles seventh with 53.27, 800m fifth with 2:26.31, 4x200r. third with 1:59.61. Trampas Jeffreys-javelin sixth with 111'1".
