

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) reports handling the following business:

-MCSO received a report from a caller in Boardman who said his apartment had been broken into and money and possibly other items taken.

-MCSO received a report that someone stole a motor out of a boat in Irrigon.

-MCSO, Heppner Police Dept. received a report that a U-Haul truck and van-type trailer that was supposed to be returned to Hermiston from Heppner had not been returned.

-MCSO received a report from Oregon State Police of a verbal altercation between two people and to watch for any more calls on them.

-MCSO received a report of eight cows out on Highway 74. The owners were contacted.

-MCSO received a report of bicycles in a ditch. One bicycle was recovered.

-Clatsop County Sheriff's office reported Michael Sean Tipton, 40, was arrested on an Irrigon Justice Court warrant for Theft II and local charges. He was lodged at the Clatsop County Jail.

-MCSO, Boardman Police Dept. received a report of a juvenile wearing dark clothes and a mask hiding and chasing people.
