

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) reports handling the following business:

May 14: MCSO, Boardman Police Dept. received a report from the Texaco station in Boardman of a possible open container and underage alcohol consumption.

-MCSO received a report of a male walking on the Bombing Range Road. He had run out of gasoline. He was given a lift to Cascade Specialties.

-MCSO received report of \$800 in \$100 bills taken from a gun safe outside Heppner.

-MCSO received a report of people changing the plates on the caller's vehicles and carrying a gun.

-Irrigon ambulance received a request for an ambulance for a 77-year-old with a history of heart problems who was experiencing lightheadedness, dizziness and numbness on the right side. The patient was transported to Good Shepherd Medical Center in Hermiston.

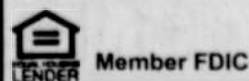
