Courthouse prepares for centennial year

On Jan. 11, 1902, the Morrow County Court authorized building a new courthouse. Nearly 100 years later, the Morrow County Courthouse is the most photographed courthouse in Oregon and 2002 marks the 100 year anniversary of the construction of the courthouse.

In recognition of the courthouse centennial, Morrow County will celebrate at community events throughout 2002. To garner community interest and participation, the Centennial Celebration Committee is showcasing this historic occasion by participating in the 2001 Morrow County Fair and Rodeo with an information booth and entry area for stories about the construction of the courthouse and its original contents.

Plans for celebrating the centennial in 2002 include tours, contests, story collection and more. An official proclamation will be declared during Heppner's Town and Country Days in January. Tours of the courthouse will be held during the St. Patrick's

Day Celebration March 15-17, enhanced for the public with musicians, 1900-era fashions and period display pieces.

Other 2002 Courthouse Centennial Celebration events include: construction ground-breaking 100 year anniversary on May 27; "Celebrate Heppner" on July 27; Morrow County Fair and Rodeo on Aug. 12-18; and Christmas at the Courthouse on Dec. 6.

Gubernatorial candidate makes Heppner stop

Ron Saxton, candidate for the Republican nomination for Governor in the November 2002 election, met last week with nearly 200 business, community, news media and political leaders in Central Oregon. Saxton has now visited with Oregonians in 32 of the state's 36 counties, gaining additional support for his gubernatorial nomination.

Traveling over 900 miles in five days, Saxton talked with citizens in Heppner, Boardman, Bend, Redmond, Prineville, Fossil, Condon, Wasco, The Dalles, Hood River and Cascade Locks to discuss his plans for leading the state and to get direction on issues important to Oregonians. Saxton will continue to meet with citizens throughout the state in preparation for the May, 2002 primary election.

"People gave me a clear direction for leading this state," Saxton said.

"They need a Governor who recognizes the need to heal the division between Oregon's rural and urban citizens. They need a Governor who wants them to get a fair return for taxes they pay. They need a Governor who understands the need for a strong, growing economy. I am committed to making sure that all Oregon children have access to the best educational resources, that there is a balance of jobs and the environment, and that economic opportunity is as strong in Heppner as it is in Beaverton," Saxton said.

Saxton, who announced his campaign for the Republican gubernatorial nomination on June 1, is touring the state to present his goals in leading the state and to learn more about Oregonians' concerns and needs.

"From land use to the environment, energy to the economy and education, it is clear that the people of Oregon

are looking for a leader who understands both small town and urban needs," Saxton said. "I have that understanding and I will be a Governor who focuses on the things that bring us together, not divide us. We can have economic prosperity and quality education for all Oregonians."

An Albany native, Saxton was a founder of the Ater Wynn law firm where he currently practices business law. He has a long history of community service, including the Portland School Board, the Portland Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce, the Juvenile Court System, Boys and Girls Club and Little League Baseball. He has been involved in Republican campaigns during the past 20 years.
