

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) reports handling the following business:

-MCSO received a report of two missing black angus bulls. They were last seen along Little Butter Creek where four other bulls were at.

-MCSO, Boardman Fire Dept. received a report of a fire alarm at Columbia Processing in Boardman. The alarm was cancelled.

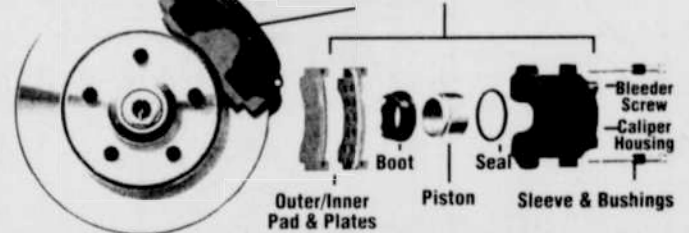

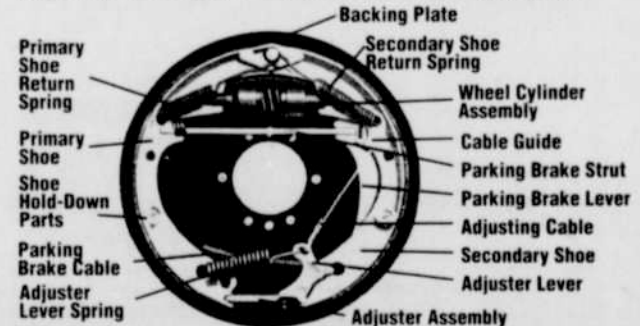

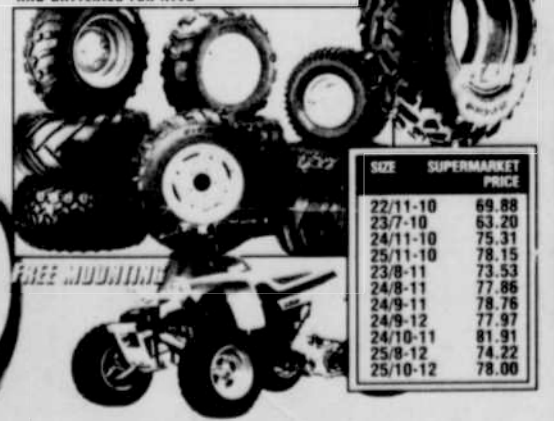
