Orval L. Matheny

Orval L. Matheny, 77, of Heppner, died Tuesday, August 14, 2001, at St. Charles Medical Center in Bend.

Memorial service was held Monday, August 20, 2001 at Hope Lutheran Church in Heppner.

He was born February 14, 1924, at Stanfield, to Arthur and Clara Gossage Matheny. The family moved to Kansas for a time then returned to Oregon where he was raised and attended school.

After graduating from Echo High School, he joined the U.S. Army where he served as a paratrooper in the 11th Airborne Division serving three years in the South Pacific during World War II.

Following military service, he returned home and on December 31, 1945, he married Pauline A. Rauch at Pendleton. The couple moved to a home on Hinton Creek near Heppner.

For six years, Mr. Matheny was an employee of Pacific Power and Light Company. As a lineman, he worked for a contractor helping to build Rural Electric Administration lines in the area. That career ended when he was severely injured in an accident in 1953.

In 1959, he began farming the Rauch Ranch in lower Sand Hollow, which is now being farmed by his son.

He was named Grand Marshal of the 1994 Morrow County Fair and Oregon Trail Pro Rodeo parade.

He was a member of the Lutheran Church in Heppner and had served on the Morrow County Rodeo Board for a number of years.

Mr. Matheny enjoyed traveling, hunting, rodeos, gardening and was an avid reader. His greatest enjoyment, however, was in watching the activities of his children and grandchildren.

Survivors include his wife Pauline, son David, and daughter Sally Brosnan, all of Heppner, and daughter Sandy Fennessy of Libby, Montana; and five grandchildren.
