

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) reports handling the following business:

-Boardman Police Dept. received a request for an officer contact regarding an unwanted subject at the campground in Boardman. The male subject, who had a black dog with him, was harassing park employees.

-MCSO, Oregon State Police received a report of a black sports car spinning circles on Highway 730 in Irrigon.

-BPD requested backup while out with a subject in Boardman.

-MCSO received a report of an audible alarm at Cascade Specialties.

-MCSO received a request for a deputy contact from a caller in Irrigon regarding questions about begin a suspect in a case.

-MCSO received a report that Greg Monzo, 35, turned himself in to the Clackamas County Jail on a Morrow County Circuit Court warrant for Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle. He posted bail and was issued a court date.
