

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) reports handling the following business:

- Heppner and Ione fire depts. received a report of a fire on Blackhorse Canyon and upper Bell Canyon.
- Heppner Police Dept. received a report of juveniles in a pickup in Heppner harassing another subject and trying to start a fight. Contact was made with the juveniles and they went home.
- MCSO received a report of a lightning strike fire two miles north of Highway 207/Bombing Range Road junction. It was out of district and being fought by civilian crews.
- MCSO received a report of a possible fire; there was a large orange glow from I-84 eastbound east of Tower Road. A deputy was unable to locate the fire.
- MCSO received a report of a lightning strike fire near Juniper Canyon. The Ione Fire Chief advised he was unable to locate a fire at this location.
