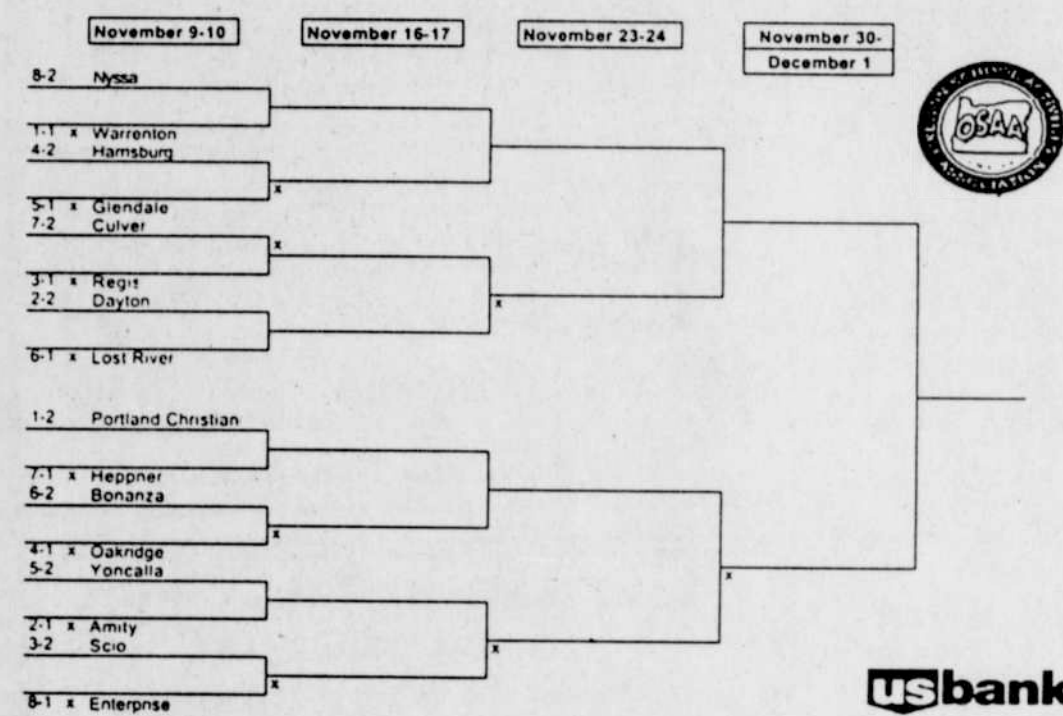


Mustangs to host Portland Christian in first round Tai Kwon Do students attend championship

The Heppner Mustangs football team will host the Portland Christian Royals in the opening round of the OSAA-U.S. Bank state 2A football players this Saturday, Nov. 10, at 1 p.m. at the Morrow County Fairgrounds.

Admission prices are \$6 for adults and \$4 for students. Ticket prices are set by the OSAA. Advanced

ticket sales are available all this week at Heppner High School.

The Mustangs advanced to the state playoffs by winning the Columbia Basin Conference championship with a 6-0 conference record. Heppner was 8-1 on the season and was rated second in the state in the latest 2A football poll.

The Royals qualified for the state playoffs by finishing in second place in the Northwest League with a 4-2 league record. Portland Christian was 4-5 overall for the season.

The winner of the Heppner-Portland Christian will play the winner of the Oakridge-Bonanza contest the following Saturday, Nov. 17.
