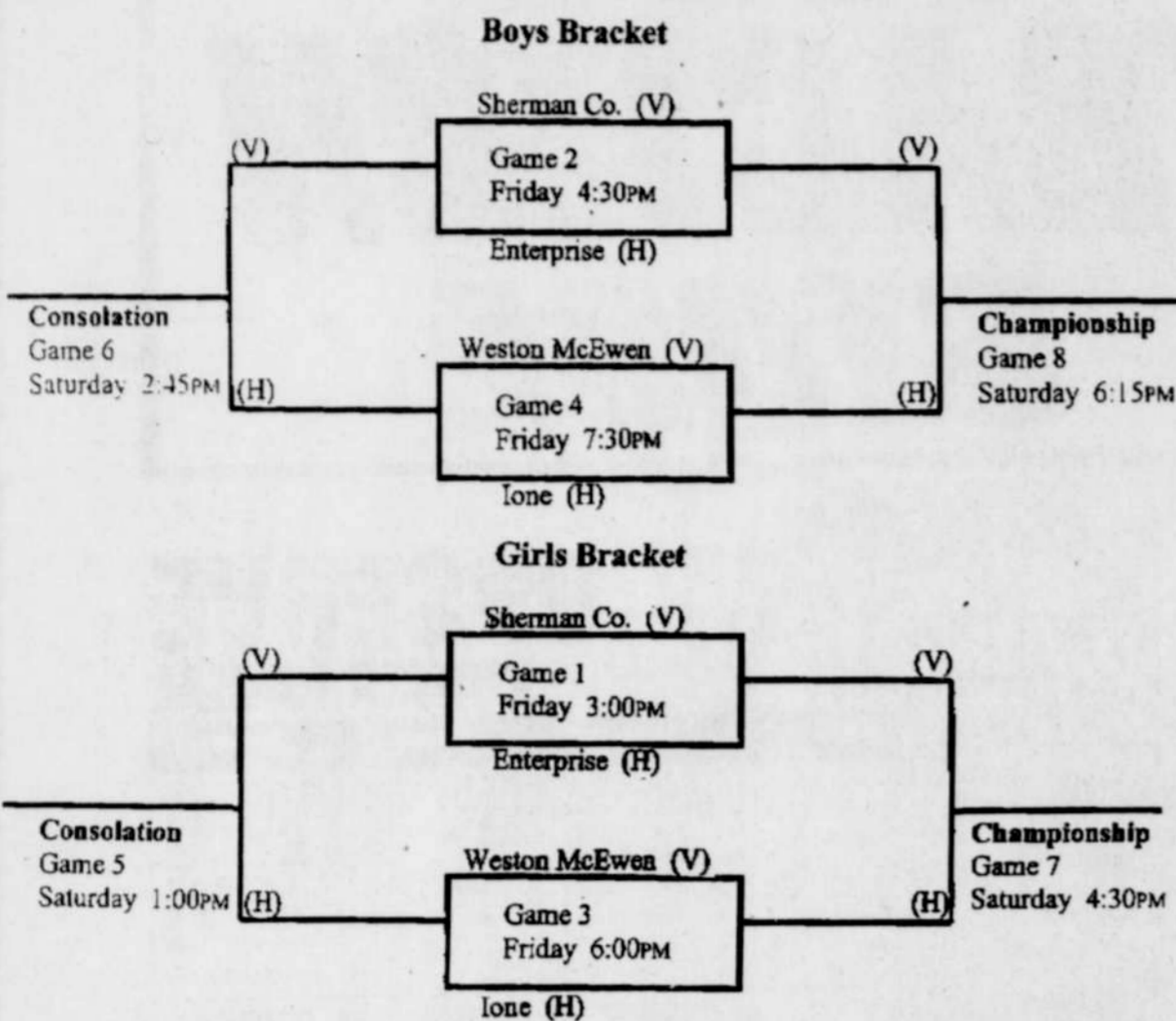


Ione Basketball Bonanza this weekend

The fourth annual Ione Basketball Bonanza Tournament will be held Nov. 30-Dec. 1 at the Ione High School Gymnasium. The teams competing this year for the title are Sherman County, Enterprise, Weston McEwen and Ione.

A girls' match up between the Enterprise Savages and the Sherman County Huskies will kick off the tournament at 3 p.m. on Friday, Nov.

30. Later to finish out the girls' first round, Ione will be taking on Weston McEwen at 6 p.m. The first boys' game will be at 4:30 p.m. with Sherman County battling Enterprise. The final game of the night has the Ione Cardinals matched up against Weston McEwen Tiger-Scots at 7:30 p.m.

The next day will begin with the girls' consolation game at 1 p.m. and the boys' consolation at 2:45 p.m.

The girls' championships match is scheduled for 4:30 p.m., followed by the boys' championship game at 6:15 p.m.

Trophies will be awarded for the top teams in each division. Ticket prices for the tournament will be \$3 for adults and \$1 for students with ASB cards. The tournament is sponsored by the Ione Booster Club.
