

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) reports handling the following business:

-Oregon State Police received a report of a suspicious vehicle on I-84 eastbound to Boardman. It was a two-ton flatbed vehicle with round brown bags that appeared to be full of liquid.

-MCSO received a request for deputy contact in Irrigon regarding a vehicle on property owned by the caller's grandson.

-MCSO received a report of a male juvenile sitting too close to the road and causing a hazard.

-MCSO deputy cited Juan Manuel Bobera, 32, for Assault IV-Domestic.

-MCSO received a report from the Irrigon Justice Court that a loose pit bull in the complainant's yard tried to attack her daughter.
