

## Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) reports handling the following business:

-MCSO deputy cited a juvenile for Possession of Less than One Oz. of Marijuana. The juvenile was cited and released.

-MCSO received a request for information from a caller in Irrigon who reported hearing a loud explosion the previous night and wanted to know what it was. The caller was advised deputies were unable to locate the source.
