

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) reports handling the following business:

Jan. 13: MCSO, Heppner Police Dept. received a report of four subjects (two males and two females) fighting behind GD's Restaurant. Officers were unable to locate any activity.

-MCSO received a request for a deputy contact regarding information the caller has on drug and theft activity.

-MCSO, OSP, Boardman Police Dept., Boardman Ambulance, MCSO K-9, Umatilla County Sheriff's Office, Umatilla Police Dept. responded to an unspecified incident.

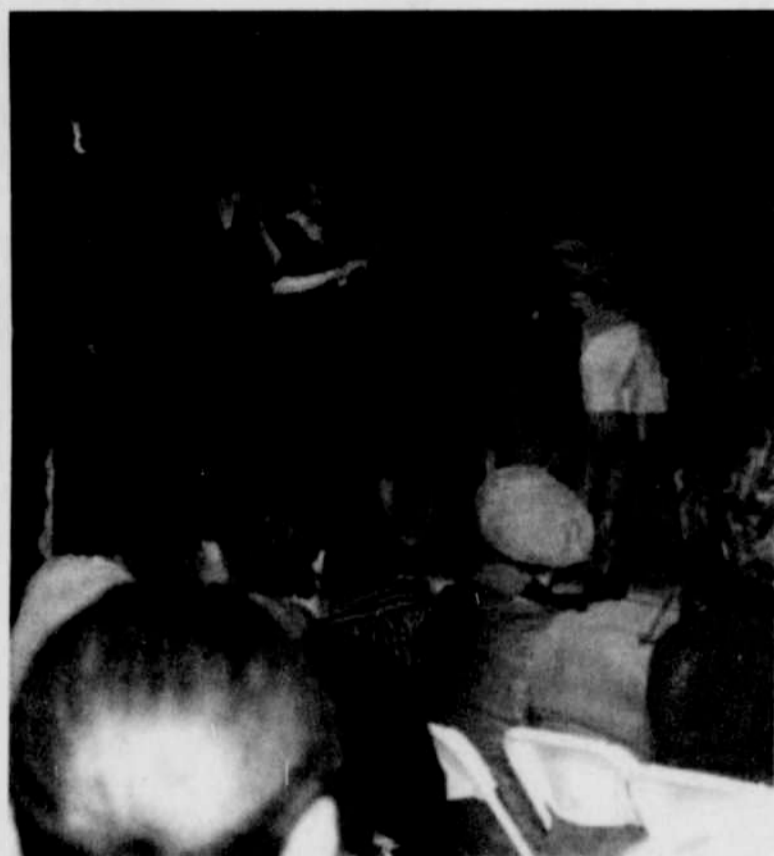
-MCSO, ODOT received a report of several small fires in the median on I-84 westbound. It was determined to be controlled burns by ODOT.
