**Commissioners appoint Watershed Council**

The Morrow County Commissioners recently appointed the Morrow Soil and Water Conservation District Board as acting Watershed Council for Morrow County by request of the SWCD Board.

Authorities for the formation of Watershed Councils were adopted in 1993 under Senate Bill 2251 and are contained in ORS 541.350. Watershed Councils are voluntary local organizations recognized by local government to address the goal of sustaining natural resources, watershed protection and enhancement within a watershed.

The Morrow Soil and Water Conservation District was chartered in the State of Oregon in 1972. The district is a legal subdivision of state government lead by an elected board of directors, formed under the authority as defined in ORS190.420 and ORS568.225. The SWCD has the authority and responsibility to assist landowners and agencies with resource problems through direct planning and on-the-ground implementation with resource owners and managers.
