IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

Tests Showed Coliform Bacteria in City of Heppner Water
Our water system recently violated a drinking water standard. Although this incident was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we did to correct this situation.

We routinely monitor for the presence of drinking water contaminants. We took two samples to test for the presence of coliform bacteria during April. Both samples showed the presence of total coliform bacteria. The standard is that no more than 1 sample per month may do so.

What should I do?
You do not need to boil your water or take other corrective actions. However, if you have

specific health concerns, consult your doctor.

People with severely compromised immune systems, infants, and some elderly may be at increased risk. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. General guidelines on ways to lessen the risk of infection by microbes are available from EPA's Safe Drinking Water Hotline at 1 (800) 426-4791

What does this mean?

This is not an emergency. If it had been, you would have been notified immediately. Coliform bacteria are generally not harmful themselves. Coliforms are bacteria which are naturally present in the environment and are used as an indicator that other, potentially-harmful, bacteria may be present. Coliforms were found in more samples than allowed and this was a warning of potential problems.

Usually, coliforms are a sign that there could be a problem with the system's treatment or distribution system (pipes). Whenever we detect coliform bacteria in any sample, we do follow-up testing to see if other bacteria of greater concern, such as fecal coliform or E.coli, are present. We did not find any of these bacteria in our subsequent testing.

What happened? What was done?

We have increased sampling for coliform bacteria to catch the problem early if it recurs.

MCKENZIE COMMERCIAL THIN

The Heppner Ranger District is conducting an environmental analysis on the proposed McKenzie Thin projects. These projects would be located within Morrow County, Oregon, at T. 6 S., R. 29 E., Section 4, W. M. surveyed (see enclosed map).

The purpose of these projects is to address two concerns. To reduce the overstory stocking levels to improve stand health by removing mistletoe infected Western Larch by a commercial thin and pre-commercially thin the understory to prevent stagnation and develop a healthy vigorous two story stand. These projects would thin approximately 28 acres.

Groupo Condor brings music to Irrigon and Boardman youth

The charango, a small ten-stringed guitar made of an armadillo shell; its tiny cousin the waylacho, the mysterious ronroco and ancient flutes will join the Spanish Guitar in a program of traditional music of Mexico and South America for AC Houghton students on May 1 at 2 p.m. The performances will be repeated at 8 a.m. on May 2 at Columbia Middle School in Irrigon and 1 p.m. at Sam Boardman Elementary School.

Musicians include leader Geraldo Calderon of Mexico, percussion by Samuel Beccera and strings and vocals by Javier Rosales of Bolivia. Particular attention is given to music of the Andes Mountains, exploring the Incan, Spanish and African influences. Groupo Condor's musicians perform a wide variety of rhythms on numerous instruments. 
