

Cards take first and second at Pendleton JV track meet

The Cardinal boys ran away with first place and the girls took second when the lone track teams traveled to Pendleton to participate in the Pendleton JV track meet on Tuesday, April 30.

For the boys, Andrew Rietmann finished first in the 100m dash with 11.12, first in the 200m dash with 22.95, and first in the 400m dash with 53.62. Brad Burright took first in the 110m hurdles with 14.72, first in the 300m hurdles with 41.12, first in the long jump, jumping 21'4", and first in the triple jump, jumping 41'9". Mike Radie placed second in the 100m dash with a time of 11.42 and second in the 200m dash with a time of 23.73. Cayle Krebs finished second in the discus, throwing 121'11", eighth in the shot put throwing 37'1" and 13th in the 100m dash with a time of 12.44. Til Tullis placed third in the 110m hurdles with 19.15, and fourth in the 300m hurdles with 49.56. Karl Morgan finished seventh in the 110m hurdles with a time of 24.00, 14th in the discus with a throw of 88'09", 15th in the javelin with a throw of 94'4", and 18th in the shot put with a throw of 31'05".

Cody Bergstrom placed 15th in the 1500m run with a time of 5:30.05, and seventh in the 3000m run with a time of 12:13. Derek Campbell finished ninth in the 400m dash with a time of 1:00.23rd in the javelin with a throw of 86'02", and 15th in the shot put with a throw of 34'02". Tim Doherty finished 15th in the 400m dash with a time of 1:05, and 12th in the 800m dash with a time of 2:45. Austin Arabello placed 14th in the 800m with a time of 3:15, 25th in the discus with a throw of 41'08", 30th in the javelin with a throw of 58'08", and 31st in the shot put with a throw of 19'02". Ashley Roberts placed third in the

javelin, throwing 131'11", and fifth in the triple jump, jumping 33'10". The 4x100m relay team of Radie, Roberts, Krebs and Rietmann finished first with a time of 45.59. The 4x400 relay team of Campbell, Roberts, Radie and Tullis finished fourth with a time of 4:05.66.

In Lady Cardinal action, Cyndi Heagy finished second in the 100m dash at 13.26 and second in the 400m dash at 1:04.24. Diana McElligott finished first in the 200m dash with a time of 27.42 and finished first in the 400m dash with a time of 1:02.16. Amellia Peck placed second in the 100m hurdles with 17.57, second in the 300m hurdles with 50.17, and second in the discus with 98'10". Kim Morris finished sixth in the 1500m run with a time of 6:30, and sixth in the high jump with a jump of 4'2". Missy Baker finished 12th in the 100m dash at 14.35, eighth in the 200m dash at 30.81, 12th in the discus at 66'0", and ninth in the shot put at 26'4".

Brittany Day finished fifth in the 100m hurdles with a time of 19.13 and 13th in the long jump with a jump of 9'9". Jaysi Bennetto placed seventh in the 100m hurdles with a time of 20.15, third in the 3000m run with 14:29, and eighth in the triple jump with 25'5". Eva Chitty finished sixth in the 200m dash with a time of 30.58 and sixth in the long jump with a jump of 13'6". Barbara Holland placed 11th in the discus with a throw of 66'7", 10th in the javelin with a throw of 70'5", and fifth in the high jump with a jump of 4'2". Kasie Peterson finished 19th in the javelin with a throw of 42'05". The 4x100m relay team of D. McElligott, Peck, Heagy and N. McElligott finished second with a time of 53.27. The 4x400m

relay team of Heagy, Morris, Holland and Chitty finished fifth with a time of 4:48.33.

Chlorinated water could get fishy for fish

The City of Heppner Public Works crews will be doing routine maintenance on the City water reservoirs on Friday, May 17. As part of the maintenance activity, the crews will be adding chlorine to the water for disinfection purposes.

While the chlorine in the water will be at a low level, it may cause a noticeable smell when water is drawn from the tap. Coffee made with chlorinated water may also have a different flavor. The chlorine is not harmful to humans at the dosage which will result at the customer's tap. Residents should be advised, however, that fish in tanks are very sensitive to chlorine and may be injured if chlorinated water is added to their tank.

Heppner water personnel suggest that if people find the chlorine odor objectionable or if they need to change the water in a fish tank, that they draw sufficient water ahead of Friday for that use. Chlorine can also be removed by storing the water in an open container for several hours and allowing the chlorine to dissipate.

City crews appreciate the understanding of the citizens of their work to keep the water system safe and operating at optimum efficiency, said Craig Canham, Heppner Public Works Director.

Cardinals place at districts, now it's on to state

The lone Lady Cardinals took first place and the boys took second at the 3-1A district track meet held in Hermiston on May 10-11.

The Lady Cardinals were led by Natalie McElligott and Diana McElligott with three first place finishes each. Natalie won the long jump, jumping 15'4". She also won the triple jump with a jump of 33'9", and the high jump with a jump of 4'10". Natalie qualified for state in all three events. Diana McElligott finished first in the 100m dash with 13.12, first in the 200m dash with 26.63, and first in the 400m dash with 1:02.41. Diana also qualified for state in all three events.

Amellia Peck took first in the 300m hurdles with a time of 49.74, second in the 100m hurdles with 17.48 and third in the discus with 85'4". Amellia qualified for state in the 110m hurdles and the 300m hurdles. Cyndi Heagy finished second in the 100m dash with a time of 13.69 and second in the 400m dash with a time of 1:03.90. Cyndi qualified for state in both events. Barbara Holland placed second in the high jump with a jump of 4'6", qualifying for state.

The 4x100m relay team of Amellia Peck, Cyndi Heagy, Natalie McElligott and Diana McElligott finished first with a time of 52.04, qualifying for state. The 4x400m relay team of Cyndi Heagy, Barbara Holland, Eva Chitty and Kim Morris finished first with a time of 4:44.75, qualifying for state. Brittany Day finished third in the 100m hurdles with a time of 19.35 and fourth in the 300m hurdles with a time of 1:00.63. Kim Morris finished third in the 1500m run with a time of 6:54 and fifth in the high jump with a jump of 4'2". She also

placed fifth in the 800m run with a time of 3:07.

Jaysi Bennetto finished third in the 3000m run with a time of 13:54, fifth in the 100m hurdles with a time of 20.4 and fifth in the triple jump with a jump of 27'10". Missy Baker finished fourth in the 200m dash with a time of 30.31 and fifth in the 100m dash with a time of 14.77. Eva Chitty finished fifth in the pole vault with a jump of 6'6" and fifth in the long jump with a jump of 13'5".

Brad Burright was a four-time winner for the boys. Brad took first in the 110m hurdles with 15.01, first in the 300m hurdles with 39.99, first in the long jump with 21'6" and first in the triple jump with 42'7". Brad qualified for state in all four events.

Andrew Rietmann finished first in the 100m dash at 11.48, first in the 200m dash at 23.37 and first in the 400m dash at 52.03. Andrew qualified for state in all three events. Cayle Krebs placed second in the discus with a throw of 119'2" and second in the shot put with a throw of 40'3". Cayle qualified for state in both events. Mike Radie finished third in the 100m dash with a time of 12.06 and third in the 200m dash with a time of 24.01. Mike qualified for state in the 200m dash.

The 4x100m relay team of Mike Radie, Andrew Rietmann, Cayle Krebs and Ashley Roberts finished first with a time of 45.85, qualifying for state. Til Tullis finished fourth in the 110m hurdles with a time of 19.31, sixth in the 300 hurdles with a time of 49.01, and sixth in the long jump with a jump of 16'9". Ashley Roberts finished fourth in the javelin with a throw of 128'10" and fifth in the triple jump with a jump of 37'9".

Cody Bergstrom finished sixth in the 1500m run with a time of 4:42. The 4x400m relay team of Ashley Roberts, Til Tullis, Tim Doherty and Derek Campbell finished sixth with 4:07.

The state track meet will be held in Monmouth at Western Oregon College on Saturday, May 18, starting at 11 a.m.
