**4-H members use Senate Floor**

There was a different look on the Capitol Senate Floor in Salem recently. All the senators and the Senate President were very young - high school age to be exact.

Those young people sitting in the senators' chairs and presiding at the Senate President's podium were 4-H members taking part in the 2002 4-H Know Your State Government Conference (KYSG), May 2-4. Jeff Hunt of Lone attended the conference.

The KYSG Conference was historical for several reasons. Not only was it the first KYSG to be held in a legislative "off-year", but it was also the first time the 4-H group had the opportunity to conduct a mock legislative session on the actual Senate Floor. The night before the mock session, delegates developed two bills to be presented before the "senate". The ideas were real issues that the youth were concerned about.

After participating in a "critical thinking" session in which the delegates prioritized a number of issues, the youth agreed to two major ideas that were then written up and presented to the senate as bills.

At one point, KYSG Senate President Leyla Estes from Crook County, who presided from the president's podium, yielded her seat to the real Senate President, Gene Derfler. Senator Derfler spoke to the delegates for about 45 minutes, with most of the time being spent answering questions asked by the 4-H members. Other speakers during the day included, Duane Bales, the assistant to Speaker of the House Mark Simmons, Greg Chaimov from Legislative Counsel, Senator Peter Courtney and Nancy Savage from the Salem FBI office.

In addition to the mock legislative session, the delegates also conducted a mock gubernatorial election. Delegates were divided into 10 groups and each group took one of the 10 gubernatorial candidates listed in the Marion County voter pamphlet, and developed their candidate's platform. One youth

in each group was selected to be the candidate and on Friday, stepped up to the Senate President's podium and gave a short campaign speech. The mock primary resulted in Jim Hill, portrayed by Ariel Winegar from Grant County, as the Democrat candidate and Jack Roberts, portrayed by Jason Magnuson from Lane County, as the Republican candidate. On Saturday, the KYSG delegates elected Jack Roberts as Oregon's next governor.

Another highlight of the Conference was a Friday evening dinner cruise on the Willamette River aboard the paddle wheeler Willamette Queen. The cruise was intended to provide a cultural and historical perspective of a time in Oregon's history when riverboats were very important to the economy and social life of the people of the state.

The Conference closed on Saturday with the gubernatorial election and a quiz bowl to see how much the delegates had learned during the Conference. It was an exciting, educational and fun-filled event for over 50 Oregon 4-H members, said a spokesperson. Know Your State Government is a

Continued from April 25, 2002 Subdivision Application, SD-N-216: BAIC, Inc. and Port of Morrow, applicants and State of Oregon, owner. Property is described as tax lots 100, 103, 106, and 107 of Assessor's Map 4N 24 and is zoned General Industrial (MG). Property is five miles west of Boardman, north of Interstate 84 and west of Tower Road. Proposal is to partition the 225.70 acre tract into eight lots. Criteria for approval include Morrow County Subdivision Ordinance.

Continued from April 25, 2002 Subdivision Application SD-N-218: Frank Flock, applicant and owner. Property is described as tax lot 3600 of Assessor's Map 4N 25 20A. The property is zoned Suburban Residential (SR-1A) and is located within the Boardman Urban Growth Boundary. Property is located approximately one mile south-west of Boardman on Kunze Lane. Proposal is to divide the 6.13 acre parcel into 6 one acre lots, each meeting the 1 acre minimum. Criteria for approval include Morrow County Subdivision Ordinance.

Continued from April 25, 2002 Lexington Airport Layout Plan: The second of three hearings to consider the adoption of the Lexington Airport Layout Plan and Map, the purpose being to identify the existing configuration of the airport and to establish current and long-term airport needs. This new Airport Layout Plan (ALP) will replace and supersede the 1983 ALP Report and Environmental Assessment. The new ALP drawings reflect current conditions and facilities. The primary objective of the ALP is to identify current and future facility needs and improvements necessary to maintain a safe, efficient, economical and environmentally acceptable air transport

tation facility. The ALP study also includes a new land-use plan map for the airport and its surrounding area. The surrounding areas are subject to the existing Airport Approach Zone and Airport Hazard Zone. The affected surrounding areas have not changed from the 1983 study; however, the new ALP accurately identifies those lands that are subject to the Airport Approach and Airport Hazard Zones. Adoption of the ALP will also include a zone change of the airport, whereby aviation-related uses will be permitted outright. Criteria for consideration of the proposed Lexington Airport Layout Plan and Map includes Sections 3.010, 3.090 and 3.091 of the Morrow County Zoning Ordinance, goals and policies of the Transportation Element of the Comprehensive Plan, and the County Transportation System Plan.

Land Partition Application LP-N-312 and Conditional Use Request CUP-N-180: HM Ranches, owner and Robert Mahoney, applicant. Property is described as tax lot 300 of Assessor's Map 3S 25 and is zoned Exclusive Farm Use (EFU). Property is approximately ten miles south of Lexington and ten miles west of Heppner, on Clarks Canyon Road. Proposal is to partition the 2670.59 acre parcel into two lots with parcel one being approximately seven acres and parcel two being approximately 2663 acres and to site a "non-farm dwelling" on parcel one. Criteria for approval include Morrow County Subdivision Ordinance ARTICLE 5; the Morrow County Zoning Ordinance, Article 3 Section 3.010(F) and Article 6 Section 6.020.

Land Partition Application, LP-N-312: Craig Hulse, owner and applicant. Property is described as tax lot 1500 of Assessor's Map 5N 26 25B, is zoned Suburban Residential (SR-1), and is located within the City of Irrigon Urban Growth Boundary. Property is one tenth of a mile west of Irrigon, on Second Street with additional frontage on California Avenue. Proposal is to partition the 4.36 acre parcel into two lots, each approximately 2.2 acres meeting the one acre minimum. Criteria for approval include Morrow County Subdivision Ordinance ARTICLE 5.

Variance Application and Amendment to Land Partition LP-S-286 and Conditional Use Request CUP-S-160: Schmidt Family Enterprises, LLC, owner and Pamela Perry-Schmidt, applicant. Property is described as tax lot 6300 of Assessor's Map 1S 25 and is zoned Exclusive Farm Use (EFU). Property is approximately two miles south of the Town of Lexington, bordering Highway 74. Proposal is to allow a 15 foot access easement when a 20 foot access easement is required, changing the Conditions of Approval for Land Partition LP-S-286 and Conditional Use Request CUP-S-160. Criteria for approval include Morrow County Subdivision Ordinance ARTICLE 5, Morrow County Zoning Ordinance ARTICLE 7 Variances, and the Morrow County Transportation System Plan CHAPTER 6 Access Requirements.

Opportunity to voice support or opposition to the above proposals or to ask questions will be provided.
