

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) reports handling the following business:

MCSO received a report of smoke, possibly an illegal burn in a back yard on Gilmore Street, Heppner. A deputy was unable to locate any smoke.

Boardman Police Dept. officer cited Joyce Yuko Takeyasu, 41, for Violation of the Basic Rule, 56 mph in a 40 mph zone.

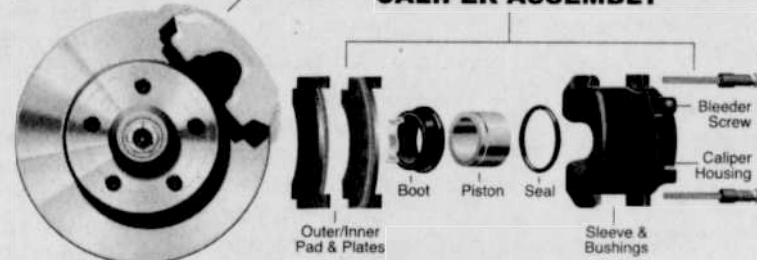

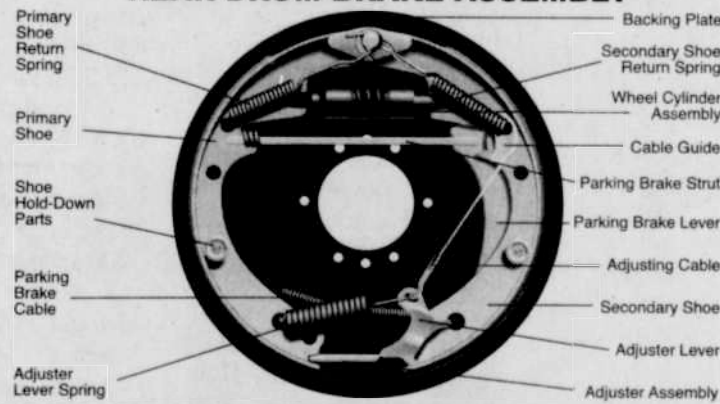
