**Court hears about ditch water measuring device**

At the August 14 meeting of the Morrow County Court, Vern Church, of the Oregon Watermaster's office, explained a ditch water measuring device to the commissioners. He described a volunteer program for irrigators and reported that he has scheduled a meeting with irrigators for August 20, at which he will explain the program that is funded 75% by a Watershed Enhancement Board grant. Church spoke of the water shortage and the questions from landowners about usage. Discussion focused on the benefits of knowing the amount of water one is using, as well as having a fair way of checking use by everyone.

Mental Health Director Kelly Sager spoke again with the commissioners about the retreat scheduled for October 21 and 22 and funded by his department. The Court agreed to speak to department supervisors about the possibility of half-day attendance for staff members.

Assessor Greg Sweek reported a possible division of the Horseshoe Bend property among three adjacent property owners. The Court examined the options presented by Sweek and Administrative Secretary Andrea Denton, and agreed to calculate the acreage and send a letter to the landowners offering the parcels for sale.

Denton also presented a detailed year-end report on the county telephone system, illustrated by department, fund, type, and major vendor.

Sweek spoke to the Court and Public Works Director Burke O'Brien about the curb and sidewalk configuration in front of the courthouse, resulting from the reconstruction of the Court Street intersection. O'Brien agreed to contact the City for information on complete plans for that project and to work at a temporary plan for the space between the curb and sidewalk. O'Brien also reported that underground fiber optics line would be connected to the courthouse by the end of the week, precluding the need for temporary overhead lines.

O'Brien reported the progress on the Juniper Canyon project,
