## **Mustangs get past Tigers 41-16**

The Heppner Mustangs capped off their fourth consecutive Columbia Basin Conference undefeated season by getting past a pesky Stanfield Tiger team, 41-16, on Friday, Nov. 1 in Stanfield. The Mustangs finished the regular season at 8 and 1 overall and 6 and 0 in the CBC.

As the number one seed out of the CBC, the Mustangs will be at home in the first round of the OSAA State 2A playoffs against the number two seed out of the Tri-River League the Kennedy Trojans. The game will be at 1 p.m. on Saturday, Nov. 9. Kennedy, of Mt. Angel, lost to Regis 6-0 on Friday to end up in second place.

On a cold, frosty night in Stanfield the Tigers took the opening kick-off and drove into Mustang territory before Jode Coil picked off a pass inside the

10-yard line and returned to the 27-vard line. On first down, Tanner Britt hit Justin Botefuhr for a 17-yard gain. Brad Adams ran twice for seven yards and Kyler Lovgren went for eight vards and a first down at the Tiger forty-one.

After two motion penalties and a loss of four yards, Britt hit Adams for a 36-yard gain to the eighteen. Tyler Boyer took it to the seven where Lovgren took it in from there for the touchdown and kicked the extra point for a 7-0 lead midway through the first quarter.

The defense held and the Mustangs took over at their own thirteen after the punt. Adams went for 18 yards; Boyer went for five then broke free for a 38yard gain. Britt hit Lovgren for a 19-yard gain to the seven where Adams ran twice, the second one from five yards out for a touchdown. The kick was no

at their own thirty-nine. Adams made a nice one-handed catch of a pass from Britt and turned it into a 20-yard gain. A holding penalty on the next play took the ball back to the Mustangs 46yard line, but Britt hit Coil for 33 yards to the twenty-two. A fumble gave the ball back to the Tigers to kill the drive and the half ended with the Mustangs clinging to a 19-16 lead.

On the Mustangs first drive of the second half another fumble killed a drive but the defense held with Coil bringing the punt back to the thirty-one getting a crushing block from Botefuhr. Lovgren then broke free and raced 69 yards for the touchdown. The two-point conversion failed but the Mustangs had a 25-16 lead.

Botefuhr picked off a pass on the Tigers next possession but the Mustangs gave up the ball on downs.

Britt then picked off a pass as the quarterback was being hit by Connor Kilkenny and went 37 yards for a touchdown. Britt hit Botefuhr for the two-point conversion for a 33-16 lead with 4:53 left in the third quarter.

Boyer ran twice for 10 yards, Lovgren went for 12 to the five where Adams took it in for the touchdown. Britt hit Murray for the two-point conversion to make it 41-16 early in the fourth.

Britt picked off another pass at midfield and the Mustangs drove inside the fifteen but the drive stalled and the Tigers took over on downs.

The defense was led by Donald Adams with 29 points, with Brad Adams getting 27 points, Botefuhr and Coil each

Lovgren, in his first game back from a broken thumb, ran 11 times for 142 yards with Adams rushing 20 times for 119 yards. Boyer had five carries for 64 yards.

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) presented the award to ODOT after reviewing over 200 Internet sites. Bruce Warner, ODOT Director, accepted the award at the American Association of State Highway Transportation Officials' (AASHTO) annual meeting held earlier this month in Anchorage, Alaska.

"In the past year, TripCheck.com has received three national awards- one from the Intelligent Transportation Society of America, one from AASHTO, and now one from the Federal Highway Administration," said Galen McGill, ODOT's Intelligent Transportation Systems Manager. "This national recognition, along with continued positive response from the public, is very gratifying. It tells us that we are providing a high quality, valuable service to the citizens of Oregon."

Site users can scan regional winter travel and national weather reports, and view data provided by roadside weather stations, such as temperature, wind speed and precipitation readings. Over 120 traffic cameras allow near-real time views of travel and weather conditions, location, elevation and camera direction for most images. TripCheck.com maps detail present road conditions and spots to avoid - including road construction, maintenance work and traffic incidents.
