The Morrow County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) reports handling the following business:

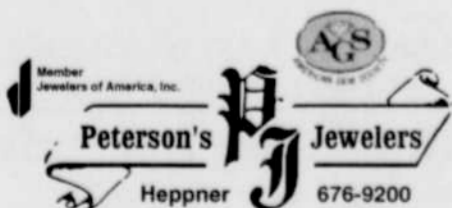
Heppner Elementary and Ione Elementary schools had a pleasant surprise when they received backpacks from the Lutheran Brotherhood Church, for any child in need of one.
