Frances Parker Mitchell, 97, died Thursday, May 8, 2003, at Pioneer Memorial Nursing Home in Heppner.

May 16, at 1 p.m., at the Prairie Creek Cemetery in Joseph, OR. Disposition was by cremation.

Mitchell was born April 23, 1906, at Cove, OR, to Frank S. and Gertrude Crawford Parker. The family lived in Union County until 1908. They moved to a ranch in Idaho, along the Snake River, where they lived for four years. They then moved to the Willamette Valley for a short time. Then in 1913, they family moved to Heppner where Mitchell started school. She graduated from Heppner High School in 1923.

She attended Monmouth Teachers College at Monmouth, OR. Her first school was in Wallowa County at Hurricane Creek where she taught for three years, and then she taught first grade at Joseph in the 1927-28 school year. During World War II, when teachers were hard to find, she returned to teaching and taught one year at Divide in Wallowa County School District #9. She also taught a half-year in Morrow County in Heppner.

In 1928, she was married to Dorris E. Mitchell of Joseph, at her parents' home in Heppner. The couple had one daughter, Lorene. The Mitchells lived in Wallowa County until Dorris passed away in 1945.

After the death of her husband, Mitchell returned to Heppner and accepted the position of Morrow County Deputy Sheriff and Tax Collector. She was employed in this capacity and also as County Treasurer until 1953, when she resigned to take other employment in Portland. She accepted a position with Mallow-Robinson Lighting Fixtures and worked as a bookkeeper for the next 22 years.

Mitchell was a charter member of the Soroptimist International in Heppner and served as their first treasurer. She was a member of the First Christian Church and Credit Women's International, holding many offices in both.

Mitchell was a "marvelous" seamstress. She had the pleasure of making her daughter's wedding dress, as well as making many clothes for herself and other family members.

In 1995, Mitchell returned to Heppner, her sixth move to Heppner in her life.

Survivors include her daughter and son-in-law, Lorene and George Griffith; two grandchildren, Charlotte Griffith of Portland and Glenn Griffith and wife, Kelly of Ione; and two great-granddaughters, Tracy and Jennifer Griffith of Ione; sister, Kathryn Hoskins of Heppner, and many nieces and nephews. **BEO president attends banking meeting in Texas**

George Koffler, President and CEO of Bank of Eastern Oregon, attended a meeting of the American Bankers Association's Community Bankers Council in San Antonio, Texas on May 3-5. Koffler represents Oregon community banks on the Council, which meets several times each year to provide input to the association on issues affecting the nation's community banks.

New corporate governance requirements, credit union competition, reform of the nation's deposit insurance system and issues relating to homeland security were prominent on the council's agenda. Members advised ABA on community bank needs in these areas and shared their views on other management issues, including the effect their local economies are having on their institutions.

The ABA Community Bankers Council consists of 100 bankers from institutions generally with under \$1 billion in assets. Members are appointed from all 50 states by the ABA president.

"These meetings offer a great way — both for me personally and for the ABA — to learn more about the challenges and opportunities that community bankers around the country are facing," said Koffler.

Koffler has just completed four years on the Council. He will be installed as the Chairman of the Board of the Oregon Bankers Association at their annual convention in June.

**DA's Report**

Jason John Trickle was convicted of Criminal Mischief-2, a Class-A misdemeanor; Interfering with Making a Report, a Class-A misdemeanor; and Assault-4, a Class-A misdemeanor. **BEO makes donation to flood memorial**



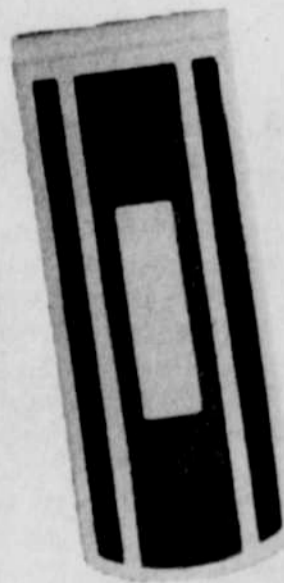
