Mustangs rout Vikings 17-4

The Heppner Mustangs wrapped up the Columbia Basin Conference season with a 17-4 win in six innings over the Umatilla Vikings in Umatilla on Tuesday, May 20. The Mustangs ended up 11-1 in the CBC East division and 21-4 overall heading into the District Tournament.

The Mustangs wasted no time in jumping out to a big lead against the Vikings in the first inning when Chuy Elguezabal led off with a walk and Brad Adams hit a long home run into the trees in left-centerfield. Then Billy Gates doubled, Donald Adams scored him a single, Kyler Lovgren walked, and Josh Gutierrez walked. Three runs scored when Jode Coil reached on an error, Elguezabal then hit a homerun to right to make it 8-0.

In the third, Josh Winters hit a solo homerun to centerfield, Brad Adams and Kory Paullus singled, Gates walked, Donald Adams reached on a fielder's choice and four more runs scored as Gutierrez and Coil reached on errors to make it 13-0.

The Vikings scored four runs in the fifth to make it 13-4, but the Mustangs put the game away in the sixth when Luke Murray singled, Conor Kilkenny reached on a fielder's choice, one run scored when Paullus reached on an error, Cody Walton singled, Donald Adams and Ben Turrell had RBI singled and another run scored on a wild pitch to make it 17-4.

Donald Adams went four innings to pick up the win striking out four, allowing just three hits and two walks.

He also helped himself at the plate going three for four and scoring twice. Brad Adams went two for two with two RBI, Josh Gutierrez went two for four, Elguezabal had two RBI and scored twice and Gates, Lovgren and Paullus each scored twice.

Mustangs sweep Echo/Stanfield in softball

The Heppner Mustang softball team ended their season on a good note by sweeping the Echo/Stanfield Tigers 22-4 and 9-2 on Tuesday, May 20 in Echo. The Mustangs ended up with an 8-12 record in the Eastern Oregon League and 9-16 overall, but won six of their last eight games.

The Mustangs scored six in the first in game one on an RBI double by Nikki Sisk and RBI singles by Emily Bergstrom and Blake Allstott, and three more runs came in on errors.

In the second, Krystal Nairns had an RBI single and two more runs were scored on errors to make it 9-3.

In the third, Sisk has an RBI single to make it 10-4 and they added four more in the fourth on a RBI walk by Marcy Miller, and two RBI double by Sisk and an RBI single by Nairns.

They put the game away in the fifth on an RBI double by Meghan McCabe, an RBI single by Stefanie Hanson, an RBI single by Miller, a two RBI double by Sisk, an RBI single by Nairns and RBI singles by McCabe and Chelsey Betsinger to make it 21-4.

Allstott picked up the win on the mound with relief from Hanson.

In the second game the Tigers had a 1-0 lead until the fifth inning when Hanson walked, Bailey singled, Miller grounded out to score a run to tie it, Sisk brought home the go-ahead run as she reached on an error and three more runs came in as Geer and Jesse Kempas each reached on errors to make it 5-1.

They added four more in the sixth when Hanson walked, Sisk had an RBI single, Allstott singled, McCabe walked, Geer walked to force in a run and Kempas scored two more with a single.

The Tigers scored a run in the bottom of the seventh but Kempas struck out two of the next three batters to end the game.

Kempas picked up the win striking out eight, no walked and three hits.

Sisk had two RBI and scored twice, Kempas had two RBI and Hanson scored twice.

The game marked the final game for seniors, Nikki Sisk, Marcy Miller, Jesse Kempas and Alecia Geer.
