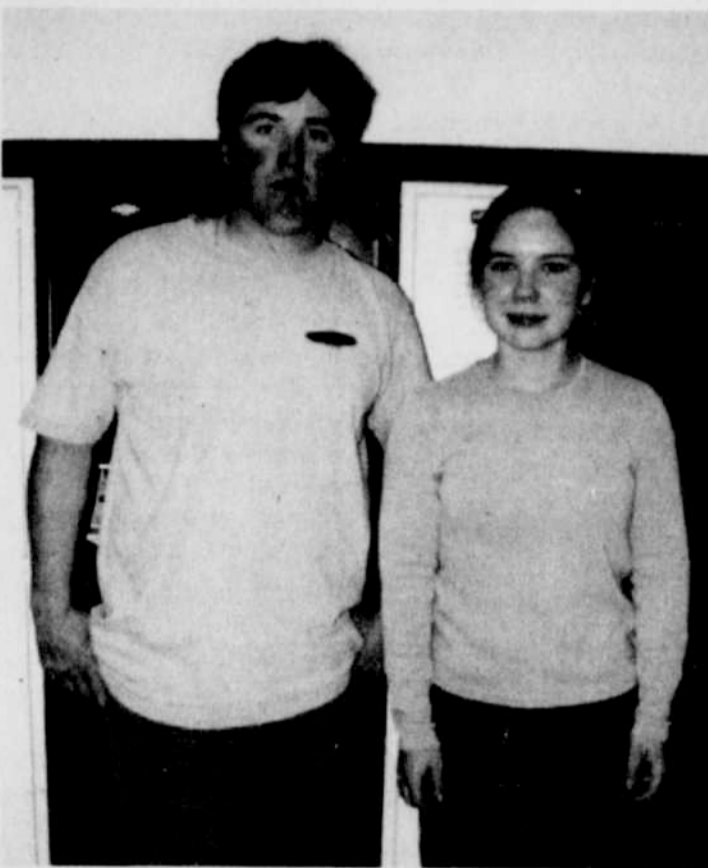
Spanish Awards, presented by Karen Holland, went to Alyssa Rietmann, Sara Peck and Sheena Christman.
