Shriners East-West Game preparations finalized

Preparation for the 51st annual Shrine East-West Football game were finalized in LaGrande on Saturday, July 19, when the committee ironed out the remaining details of the game. The association is represented by twenty-eight shrine clubs throughout Oregon and composed of eighteen committee heads and directors. Approximately 150 high schools participate in this activity, producing 120 graduate seniors for the August game. Each team will consist of a 30-man player squad and a 30-man alternate squad, each of which is comprised of 14 from the 3A schools, 12 from 2A schools and four from 1A schools.

Representing our area are, Cayle Krebs and Andrew Rietmann, from Ione and Donald Adams and Brad Adams, from Heppner.

Each team is represented by a queen and this year Simone Bailey, 16, of Corvallis, will do the honors for the East Team. Representing the West Team is Angela Maurina of Vancouver, WA. Both young ladies have been patients in the Portland Unit, Shrine Hospital.

Game officials for this year's game: Albert Orton, Union, as Referee. Greg Orton, LaGrande, as Umpire and Randy Westbrook of Albany, as Linesman. Line Judge will be Craig Hoppes of Astoria. Dick Neville, Salem, will serve as Back Judge and Roger Miller fills the position of Side Judge.

Coaches are selected on a rotation basis with 3A and 2A leagues on a four-year rotation and 1A leagues on a two-year rotation. Rob Younger, of Sweet Home, will be Head Coach for the East Team. Assisting him will be Monte Nash, of John Day, and Alan Stanfield, of North Powder. For the West Team, the Head Coach will be Kurt Hargett, of Newport. Assisting him will be Jim Keizur, of Springfield, and Dan Dugan, of Keizer. The game officials and the coaching staff donate their time and talents and receive no gratuities for their efforts.

The Shrine East-West Football game is celebrating its 51st year and has become known as "The Greatest Little Football Game in the World." This event is the result of the foresight of a notable shrine/mason who saw a world of untapped talent in the 1A, 2A and 3A schools. The game was staged in Pendleton for 20 years and took up a permanent residence in Baker City in 1972. During that time frame the East-West has produced countless dollars for the Shrine Hospitals. The Shrine of North America operates 22 hospitals in Canada, the United States and Mexico and is the world's

largest philanthropy. Local units pledge their support to the Portland Unit which accepts and treats children with routine and complex orthopedic problems, neuromuscular diseases and burn reconstructive surgery. The only department that a Shrine hospital does not have is a Billing Department.

Game week will be filled with activities for young and old alike. Friday, Aug. 8, includes a golf tournament, a shotgun start, a shopping spree for the ladies, and a family picnic at Riverside Park in LaGrande at 5 p.m.

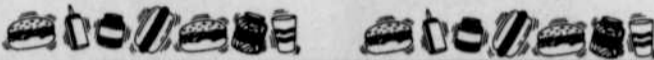
