### WC Water Quality Management Plan to be discussed at Board of Agriculture meeting

An overview of the 2003 Legislative Session and a discussion on changes to Oregon's commodity commissions will be among the topics as the State Board of Agriculture holds its quarterly meeting in Pendleton, Sept. 3-4.

The meeting is being held in conjunction with the Oregon Ag Progress Awards Dinner, also in Pendleton.

Day one of the two-day meeting will feature a roundtable overview of the current session of the state legislature and its impacts on the agriculture industry. Representatives of several agricultural organizations and interests will give their perspective on this year's developments at the State Capitol. The 10-member board will also be given a status report on the implementation of Senate Bill 854, which revamps and enhances the state's 28 agricultural commodity commissions. The board will also receive reports on activities of the Eastern Oregon Rural Alliance, the Keeping Ag Viable Program, and the Oregon Department of Agriculture's marketing efforts.

The first day ends with the Oregon Ag Progress Awards Dinner, which will

honor a number of individuals, organizations, and companies that have made significant contributions to the state's agriculture industry.

On day two, the board meeting resumes with updates on the Specialty Crop Grant Program and Senate Bill 1010 Agricultural Water Quality Management Plans. Presentations are scheduled for the Harvey and Willow Creek Water Quality Management Plan as well as an overview of SB 1010 implementation in the Walla Walla planning area. Biennial reviews are scheduled for the Yamhill and Tualatin Agricultural Water Quality Management areas.

The meeting concludes with reports from three board subcommittees dealing with the issues of agricultural sustainability, the potential of a "buy Oregon" program, and whether the Board of Agriculture should become a rulemaking body.

The board meeting begins at 8:30 a.m. on Wednesday, Sept. 3 at the Pendleton Convention Center, 1601 Westgate in Pendleton, and will resume at 9 a.m. on Thursday, Sept. 4. The meeting is open to the public.
