

Mustangs roll past Enterprise

The Heppner Mustangs scored early and often in building a 52-0 lead at halftime and cruised to a 52-12 win over the visiting Enterprise Savages on Friday, Aug. 29, to open to the 2003 season.

The Mustangs will face a much tougher team when they travel to Reedsport on Friday, Sept. 5 to face the defending Big Fir League champion Braves. The junior varsity will play two quarters before the varsity game starts at 7 p.m.

The Mustangs wasted little time as they took over at their own twenty-three after forcing a punt. Tyler Boyer ran for five yards then Chuy Elguezabal found a big hole and took off for a 72-yard touchdown run. Kyler Lovgren ran in the two-point conversion on a bobbled snap to make it 8-0 with 9:26 left in the first quarter.

Enterprise put together a drive on their next possession but the Mustangs defense held with Brandon Seitz making a tackle behind the line of scrimmage on fourth down to give them the ball at their own thirty-six.

Elguezabal then kept the ball on the option getting a good block from Jode Coil and raced down the sideline for a 64-yard touchdown. The kick was no good, but the Mustangs led 14-0.

The defense held again and this time Elguezabal took the punt all the way back for a 60-yard touchdown. Lovgren's kick was good to make it 21-0.

The defense held again with the Mustangs taking over at their own 35-yard line. Lovgren then took the handoff and sprinted 65 yards for a touchdown and after the pass failed on the two-point conversion try they led 27-0 with 2:54 left in the first quarter.

After another punt the Mustangs took over at their own 28-yard line and after Lovgren ran for 13 yards several penalties took the ball back to the eighteen. Matt Kenny ran for five yards to begin the second quarter; Elguezabal hit Tanner Britt for 24 yards, and then hit Lovgren on a screen pass for 10 yards and a first down. After a holding penalty negated a good gain, Lovgren took another screen pass 26 yards for another first down. Coil and Boyer each ran for three yards before Lovgren took it 24 yards for the touchdown. The run failed but the Mustangs had a 33-0 lead.

The Mustangs took over at the Enterprise 40-yard line after another punt and it was Boyer's turn as he raced 40 yards for a touchdown. Lovgren kicked the extra point to make it 40-0 with 6:23 left in the second quarter.

The Mustangs took over at the Enterprise forty-two after the defense held. Kenny ran for five then Matthew VanCleave hit Aaron Delveaux for a 37-yard touchdown pass. The pass failed on the conversion try but the Mustangs led 46-0 with 3:01 left.

After a deep kick-off pinned the Savages inside their 10-yard line, a fumbled snap was recovered by the Mustang's Brian Smith for a touchdown. The run failed but the Mustangs took a 52-0 lead into the locker room at halftime.

The Savages scored a touchdown in the third quarter and another in the last two minutes of the game as the Mustangs used all their players.

Under a new rule adopted by the Columbia Basin Conference, when a team is up by 45 points or more in the second half, they will play with a running clock. This gives both teams a chance to play kids who otherwise might not get a chance to play.

The Mustangs offense racked up 426 total yards, 329 on the ground, for the game with most of it coming in the first half.

Elguezabal carried twice for 136 yards and two touchdowns and was three for four, passing for 60 yards. Lovgren ran three times for 102 yards and two touchdowns and caught two passes for 36 yards. Boyer ran three times for 48 yards.

The defense was led by Kory Paullus with 18 points taking advantage of extended playing time with Boyer adding 10 points and Lovgren nine points. Smith, Seitz and Kenny each added eight points.
