

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) reports handling the following business:

-MCSO received a report of a non-injury, non-blocking motor vehicle accident at the Shell Station in Boardman.

-MCSO received a report of people filming from the overpass on Patterson Ferry Road.

-MCSO received a report from a caller in Boardman that a burglary occurred sometime today.

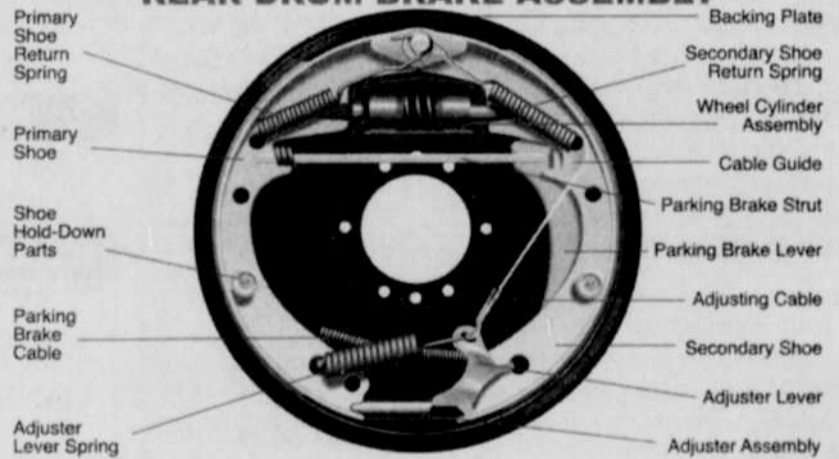
Why Do We Replace Brake Calipers?

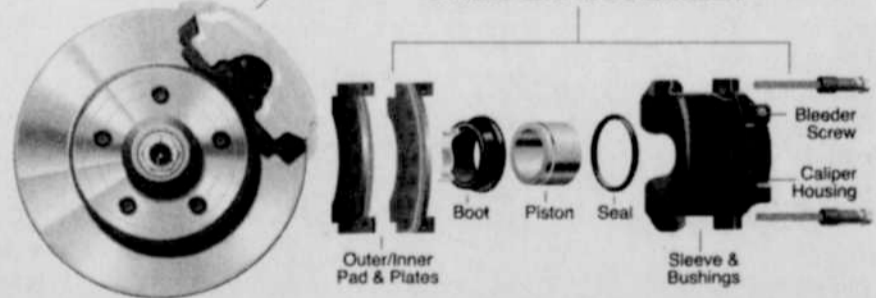
Why Replace the Drum Brake Hardware?
