

### St. Patrick's Senior Center news

Christian Life Center church members will be the volunteers for St. Patrick's meal on Wednesday, Oct. 1. The menu has not been published at this writing.

Rides are available for those who receive foot care and need transportation to the Home Health office. A foot clinic is held the first Wednesday of every month. Appointments must be made with the clinic personnel and then the name and time given to the Center office staff for a driver to be scheduled. Each appointment for foot care can take up to an hour and the cost is \$20. The transportation is a service of the Senior Center. The persons needing rides need to call one day ahead of time for drivers to be scheduled. Wednesday, Oct. 1 is the date of the next clinic.

Plans are progressing for an informational meeting to discuss legal questions senior citizens ask most frequently, as well as some they should ask for their own protection and awareness of changes or status in particular circumstances. Many questions concern long term health care, power of attorney and directives to physicians.

We encourage anyone who has a specific question, to write it out and give it to a St. Patrick's Board member or leave it at the office. Such information will be an aid to preparation for the meeting. More specific information will appear soon.

The Senior Center office is now closed on Wednesday afternoons, from 1-4 p.m. A survey of the daily activity determined that there were fewer inquiries on that day and at that time.

The Senior Board will attend the regular meeting of the Heppner Housing Authority on Monday, Sept. 29, in the lounge of the Senior Center. The purpose of the joint meeting is to review the agreement made between the two entities at the time the Center became operative.

### Food Handler's Class to be offered

A Food Handler's Class will be offered by Blue Mountain Community College and the State Health Division on Wednesday, Oct. 1, from 6:30-9:30 p.m., at the Heppner High School cafeteria.

A Food Handler's card is required by the State of Oregon for all employees who handle or prepare food in food service facilities in Oregon. This includes

dishwashers, waiters, staff and businesspersons. Additionally, the card is also now required of all day care workers. The cost of the class is a \$10 licensing fee payable to the State Health Department after successful completion of the written test.

### Sept 17 accident at Divide Wells causes death and arrest

At 5:59 p.m., on Wednesday, Sept. 17, the Umatilla County Sheriff's Office notified the Morrow County Sheriff's Office of an injury motor vehicle accident located on forest service road 5327 near Divide Wells in Southeastern Morrow County.

Upon arrival of sheriff's deputies and EMS personnel it was determined that one occupant of the vehicle was pinned under the vehicle and was deceased at the scene. A second person in the vehicle had sustained minor injuries. The accident investigation is continuing with the assistance of the Oregon State Police and US Forest Service Law Enforcement. The driver of the vehicle, Steven Allen Semone, DOB of 11/20/68, Eagle Creek, OR, was transported by ambulance to Pioneer Memorial Hospital in Heppner.

After being treated and released by the hospital Steven Semone was arrested by the Morrow County Sheriff's Office and charged with Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicants and Criminally Negligent Homicide. Steven Semone was lodged at the Umatilla County Jail on a bail of \$13,500. The deceased victim was Semone's brother, Brian Allen Simone, DOB 2/9/66, of McMinnville, OR.

### Wheat Foundation scholarship offered
