

Red Cross to offer classes

The American Red Cross will hold several classes this fall/winter. Following is the class schedule:

Standard First Aid w/AED Training: This course is designed specifically to meet the needs of business and industry, adheres to OSHA guidelines and covers topics such as shock, controlling bleeding, splinting, adult CPR, and use of automated external defibrillators. The first 4½ hours of this course is the CPR/AED section. The cost is \$42. (For only CPR/AED or only FA, the cost is \$30.)

Wednesday, Oct. 15, 6-8:30 p.m. (FA only); Monday, Oct. 20, 9 a.m.-5 p.m.; Wednesday, Nov. 5, 9 a.m.-5 p.m.; Monday, Nov. 17, 9 a.m.-5 p.m.; Friday, Dec. 5, 9 a.m.-5 p.m.

Babysitter Training:

Designed for today's 11- to 15-year-old. Babysitter's Training gives participants the knowledge, skills, and confidence to care for infants through school-aged children. Babysitter's Training addresses safety issues, preventing injuries and illnesses, basic child care, first aid, decision-making skills and age-appropriate behavior and play. Cost is \$35.

Saturday, Oct. 25, 9 a.m.-5:30 p.m.

Infant/Child CPR Training:

Teaches easy-to-learn emergency procedures that prepare individuals for breathing and cardiac emergencies for infants and children. This class includes Infant/Child CPR. The cost is \$30. (To combine this class with First Aid, the cost is \$42.)

Tuesday, Oct. 14, 6-10 p.m.

First Aid/CPR/AED Instructor Course:

This course will certify participants to teach American Red Cross First Aid and CPR with AED for adults, children and infants. Students must be at least 17 years of age and possess base level CPR and First Aid certifications. Enrollment is by application. (FIT is included in the course. Must attend all three days to receive certification.) Cost is \$275.

Friday, Oct. 17, 5-9 p.m.; Saturday-Sunday, Oct. 18-19, 9 a.m.-5 p.m.

Classes will be held in Pendleton at 902 Frazier #102. Pre-registration and pre-payment is required for all classes. For information, call 276-1211.

CPR and First Aid classes to be held in Irrigon

Morrow County Child Care Resource and Referral will be holding two courses in Infant/Child CPR and First Aid, Oct. 18, in Irrigon. The class will be held at the Irrigon Head Start Center, from 8 a.m.-5 p.m.

The Child Care Division requires this class for anyone wishing to become a registered family child care provider. This class will cover

training in injury and illness prevention and emergency care. The training session will also include infant and child CPR.

In flight A, Pat Anderson took low gross, low net and least putts.

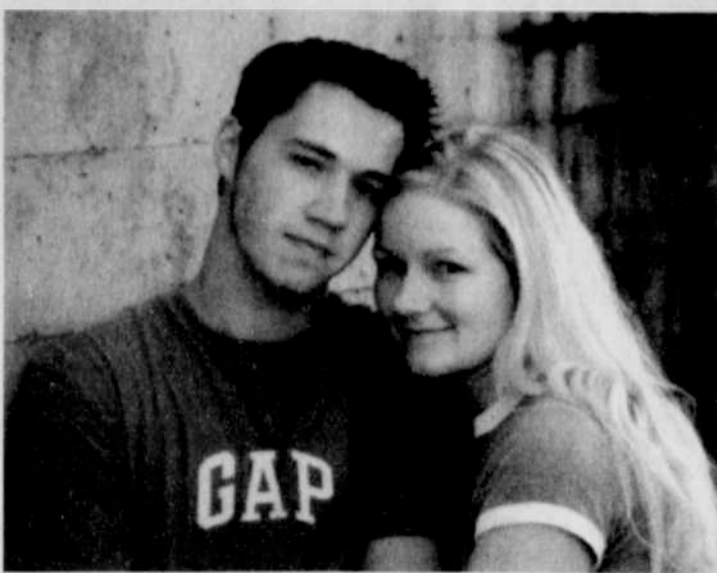
In flight B, Luvilla Sonstegard took low gross, low net and least putts.
