Thompson, Henderson and Morris received birdies on hole #9.

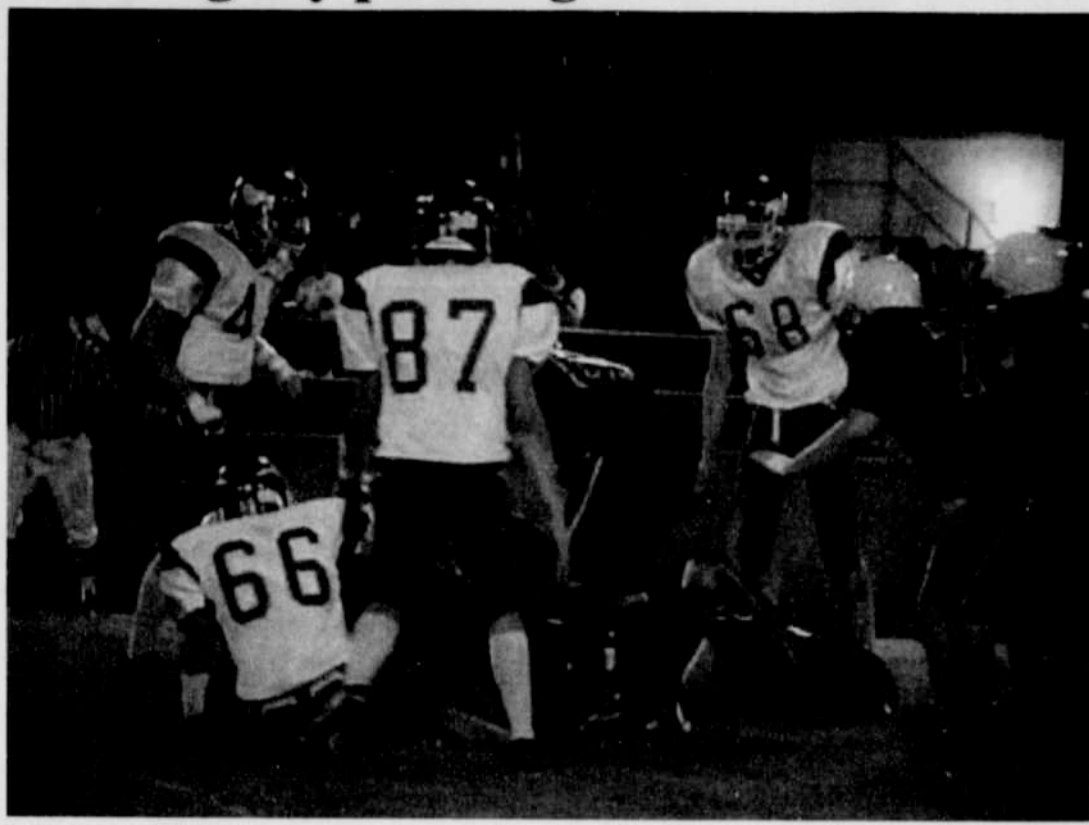

## Mustangs fly past Eagles

The Heppner Mustangs jumped out to a 21-0 lead in the first quarter and flew past the Wahtonka Eagles 59-6 on Friday, Oct. 3 in The Dalles in Columbia Basin Conference play. The Mustangs improved to 3 and 0 in the CBC and 5 and 0 overall. The Mustangs will be at Weston-McEwen on Thursday, Oct. 9 in a key league game.

The Mustangs forced a punt on Wahtonka's first possession taking over at their own 45-yard line. On the first play of scrimmage, Kyler Lovgren broke through the line and raced 55 yards for a touchdown. His extra point kick was good to make it 7-0 early in the first quarter.

The Eagles drove inside the Mustangs 25-yard line on their next possession, but fumbled, allowing Zach Skaggs to recover it at the 21-yard line. Cody Walton ran for 20 yards, Tyler Boyer seven and Walton 15 more, but a fumble was recovered by the Eagles at their own 37-yard line.

The Eagles lost nine yards in three plays forcing a punt that Lovgren took in at his own forty-five and picking up some good blocking went untouched to the end zone for a 55-yard return for a touchdown. His kick was good to make it 14-0.

On the Eagles next possession, Justin Botefuhr picked off an Eagle pass at midfield and returned it 50 yards for a touchdown and Lovgren's kick made it 21-0 with 2:17 left in the first quarter.

The teams traded possessions until midway through the second quarter when the Mustangs took over at their own 36-yard line. Walton made 18 yards on a pass from Chuy Elguezabal and a facemask penalty tacked on another five yards. Boyer ran for 13 yards, Lovgren picked up 18 more and Elguezabal hit Brandon Seitz for a nine-yard touchdown. Lovgren threw to Seitz for the two-point conversion to make it 29-0.

The Eagles were forced to punt again which Lovgren returned 20 yards to the 36-yard line. Matthew VanCleave then hit Botefuhr for 22 yards then 14 yards and a touchdown. Lovgren's kick was good to make it 36-0 at the half.

After trading possessions to start the third quarter, VanCleave hit Boyer for a 53-yard touchdown and Lovgren's kick made it 43-0.

The Mustangs defense forced another punt and they quickly scored again as Lovgren ran for 10 yards and Botefuhr took in a pass from VanCleave and raced 61 yards for a touchdown. Casey Maben ran in the two-point

conversion to make it 51-0 midway through the third quarter.

On the Eagles next possession, Aaron Delveaux caused and recovered a fumble at the Wahtonka 36-yard line. Matt Kenny ran for nine, Delveaux picked up nine more, and Kenny picked up three more before VanCleave hit Kory Paullus for a 16-yard touchdown. Delveaux ran in the two-point conversion to make it 59-0 with 3:30 left in the third quarter.

The teams traded possessions before the Eagles used most of the fourth quarter to drive down and score their touchdown with 1:17 left in the game.

After the Mustangs recovered the outside kick attempt, Brendan McElligott picked up 23-yards on a reverse and Maben ran for 15 before the clock ran out.

VanCleave completed eight of 13 passes with no interceptions and 209 yards and four touchdowns. Botefuhr caught four passes for 114 yards and two touchdowns, with Walton catching three passes for 28 yards.

Lovgren picked up 83 yards on just three carries, with Boyer rushing six times for 42 yards.

The Mustangs totaled 488 yards for the game while giving up just 137 to the Eagles with 83 of those coming in the second half.

The defense was led by Boyer with 19 defensive points, with Skaggs getting 17 points and Botefuhr totaling 16 points. Brian Smith had 11 points and Mikel Britt had 10 points.

## Firewood cutting now allowed in Forest

"Firewood and post and pole cutting are once again allowed on the Umatilla National Forest," said John Robertson, Fire Management Staff Officer. In addition, all public-use restrictions involving the use of campfires, chainsaws, generators, smoking and travel have been lifted. "Though the recent rain and cooler temperatures have allowed us to ease up on restrictions, there is still the potential for human-caused wildfires," warns Robertson.

Hunters and other forest visitors are urged to be extremely careful with their campfires, cooking fires, and wood stoves. "Campfires should be kept small, attended at all times and completely extinguished before leaving the area," said Robertson.

Firewood and post and pole cutters should call the toll-free message number, at (877) 958-9663, to see if current firewood cutting restrictions have changed. The recorded message is updated by 6 p.m. daily if there are any changes in restrictions.
