IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER
Tests Showed

Coliform Bacteria in City of Heppner Water
Our water system recently violated a drinking water standard. Although this incident was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we did to correct this situation.

We routinely monitor for the presence of drinking water contaminants. We took two samples to test for the presence of coliform bacteria during September 2003. Both samples showed the presence of total coliform bacteria. We took follow up samples which also showed the presence of total coliform. The standard is that

no more than 1 sample per month may do so.

What should I do?

• You do not need to boil your water or take other corrective actions. However, if you have specific health concerns, consult your doctor.

• People with severely compromised immune systems, infants, and some elderly may be at increased risk. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. General guidelines on ways to lessen the risk of infection by microbes are available from EPA's Safe Drinking Water Hotline at 1 (800) 426-4791

What does this mean?

This is not an emergency. If it had been, you would have been notified immediately. Coliform bacteria are generally not harmful themselves. Coliforms are bacteria which are naturally present in the environment and are used as an indicator that other, potentially-harmful, bacteria may be present. Coliforms were found in more samples than allowed and this was a warning of potential problems.

Usually, coliforms are a sign that there could be a problem with the system's treatment or distribution system (pipes). Whenever we detect coliform bacteria in any sample, we do follow-up testing to see if other bacteria of greater concern, such as fecal coliform or E.coli, are present. We did not find any of these bacteria in our subsequent testing.

What happened? What was done?

We have chlorinated the water to provide disinfection and increased sampling for coliform bacteria to catch the problem early if it recurs.

IN THE COUNTY COURT FOR THE STATE OF OREGON FOR THE COUNTY OF MORROW A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING FAIR HOUSING

LET IT BE KNOWN TO ALL PERSONS OF Morrow County that discrimination in the sale, rental, lease, advertising of sale, rental or lease, financing of housing or land to be used for construction of housing, or in the provision of brokerage, or rental services because of race, color, sex, disability (physical or mental), familial status (children) or national origin is prohibited by Title VIII of the federal Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1988. It is the policy of Morrow County to support the Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1988 and to implement a Fair Housing Program to ensure equal opportunity in housing for all persons regardless of race, color, religion, sex, disability (physical and mental), familial status (children or national origin). Therefore, the County does hereby pass the following Resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED that within the resources available to the County through city, county, state, federal and community volunteer sources, the County will assist all persons who feel they have been discriminated against because of race, color, religion, disability (physical and mental), familial status (children) or national origin in the process of filing a complaint with the Oregon Civil Rights Division or the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, Seattle Regional Office Compliance Division, that they may seek equity under federal and state laws.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County shall publicize this Resolution and through this publicity shall cause real estate brokers and sellers, private home sellers, rental owners, rental property managers, real estate and rental advertisers, lenders, builders, developers, home buyers and home or apartment renters to become aware of their respective responsibilities and rights under the Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1988 and any applicable state or local laws or ordinances.

THE FAIR HOUSING PROGRAM, for the purpose of informing those affected of their respective responsibilities and rights concerning Fair Housing law and complaint procedures, will at a minimum include, but not be limited to: 1) the printing, publicizing and distribution of the Resolution; 2) the distribution of posters, flyers, pamphlets and other applicable Fair Housing information provided by local, state and federal sources, through local media of community contacts; and 3) the publicizing of locations where assistance will be provided to those seeking to file a discrimination complaint.

On or about October 15, 2003 the above named county will request the Oregon Economic Development Department to release federal funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (PL 93-383), as amended, for the following project:

Morrow County Housing Rehabilitation Program

An Environmental Review Record has been made by the above named county which documents the environmental review of the project. This Environmental Review Record is on file at the above address and is available for public examination and copying, upon request.

Union County will undertake the project described above with Grant funds from the Oregon Economic Development Department (OEDD), under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended. The County is certifying to OEDD that the County and Terry K. Tallman in his official capacity as Judge of the Morrow County Board of Commissioners, consent to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to environmental reviews, decision-making, and action; and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. The legal effect of the certification is upon its approval, the county may use the Grant funds, and OEDD will have satisfied its responsibilities under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969. OEDD will accept an objection to its approval of the release of funds and acceptance of the certification only if it is on one of the following bases: (a) That the certification was not in fact executed by the chief executive officer or other officer or applicant approved by OEDD; or (b) that applicant's environmental review record

for the project indicates omission of a required decision, finding, or step applicable to the project in the environmental review process. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedure (24 CFR Part 58), and may be addressed to OEDD at 775 Summer Street, NE, Salem OR 97310.

Objections to the release of funds on bases other than those stated above will not be considered by OEDD. No objection received after November 4, 2003 will be considered by OEDD.
