

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) reports handling the following business:

-MCSO received a report of stolen bicycles.

-MCSO received a report from the Cutsforth Park host of a fire on Willow Creek Road, Heppner side of the park. The Forest Service was advised.

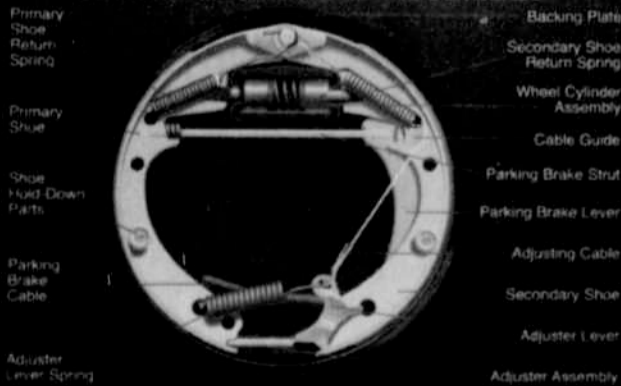
