The Morrow County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) reports handling the following business:

New officers were elected for 2004, with Barry Munkers stepping in as the new president for the outgoing Harvey Childers. Deona Hodges was voted in as a new board member joining Ron Ashbeck, Sandi Day and Kelwayne Hagewood.

Results from Sunday's gathering at the 16-yard line saw Mark Schlichting breaking 24 of 25 targets. Childers and Steven Crum each broke 22. Hagewood and Munkers racked up 20 apiece and Hodges and Day tied with 17 each.

Schlichting again had a near perfect 24 of 25 in the 20-yard handicap, followed by Childers with 22 and a three way tie with Munkers, Hodges and Day all breaking 19.

There were two Annie Oakley shoots with junior shooter Taylor Hodges winning his first Oakley and Munkers, winning the second event.
