## Dan Hill announces run for Circuit Court judge

Attorney and Judge, pro-tem, Daniel J. Hill has announced his candidacy for circuit judge for Umatilla and Morrow counties. Hill has filed for position 3, currently occupied by Judge Rudy Murgo. Hill is endorsed by Judge Murgo as his replacement. Judge Murgo has filed for election to the Supreme Court.

Hill is a practicing attorney in Hermiston and has been a practicing attorney for nearly 17 years. Most recently, Hill has been the appointed half-time circuit judge, pro-tem, for Umatilla and Morrow counties primarily responsible for prison cases, small claims, traffic, landlord-tenant matters, county nuisance cases, and other cases as assigned.

Hill was appointed circuit judge, pro-tem, by the Chief Justice of the Oregon Supreme Court after approval by the Supreme Court, upon the recommendation of the presiding judge and a select

local committee. He spent nearly three years actively on the bench conducting judicial business until budget cuts reduced his status to inactive. He has since then been reappointed as a circuit judge, pro-tem, and has performed judicial duties as requested. Prior to that Hill was a military prosecutor, city prosecutor for Hermiston and the elected municipal judge for Hermiston for six years. Hill has also been the chairman of the Umatilla County Planning Commission, a director on the BMCC Board, and a member of numerous other local committees and organizations. Hill is a Lieutenant Colonel in the Judge Advocate General's Corps, Oregon Army National Guard and also is a member of the Governor's Military Council.

Hill is married to Jacque Mack Hill, owner of I.J. Gems in Hermiston, and has one daughter Mackenzie. Hill is a life long Umatilla County resident whose family

started farming in the Pendleton area in the 1930s. Hill was born in Pendleton in 1961, to James R. Hill and Doloris V. Hill then of Pendleton. Hill graduated from Hermiston High School in 1979, BMCC in 1981, Oregon State University in 1983, and Willamette University College of Law in 1986. Hill has advanced studies in military law, and holds a diploma from the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College.

Hill is a member of the Hermiston Rotary Club, the chair of the Umatilla County Facilities Citizens' Advisory Group, and a member of the facilities advisory group now planning the Umatilla County Government and Justice Center at Hermiston.

Hill states that "I have the experience to conduct properly the judicial duties of the court, and look forward to doing so in service to the people of Umatilla and Morrow counties."
