

## Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) reports handling the following business:

-MCSO received a report from a caller in Irrigon who found a small boy, about three, on a bike with training wheels in Irrigon. No parents were around. The caller called back and advised the father found the child and no contact was needed.

-MCSO received a report from a caller in Boardman of a dog running around the neighborhood since yesterday afternoon.

-MCSO received a walk-in report from a subject who reported his vehicle was scratched with a rock sometime last night. He requested to speak to a deputy about an on-going problem.

-MCSO deputy cited Richard Lee Christian, 54, for Violation of the Basic Rule, 72 mph in a 55 mph zone.

-MCSO received a report of an audible burglar alarm at Bigfoot Industries in Boardman. The alarm was cancelled.
