In the eighty-seven years of the Oregon Elks, only forty-two members have been honored by the Association by being inducted into the Hall of Fame. Member Eugene Hall, of Heppner Lodge #358, has shown exemplary and outstanding service to

his Lodge and to the Oregon Elks. Hall has been a member of the Elks for over forty-five years, and has served the State Association for more than thirty-two years. He has held virtually all local Lodge positions and served on several State committees, including many years as a State Committee chair. He was a member of the famed "River Rats" under Grand Exalted Ruler Frank Heise. He is a past Exalted Ruler of the Heppner Lodge, and Past District Deputy of the Grand Exalted Ruler for the Oregon Elks North-East district.

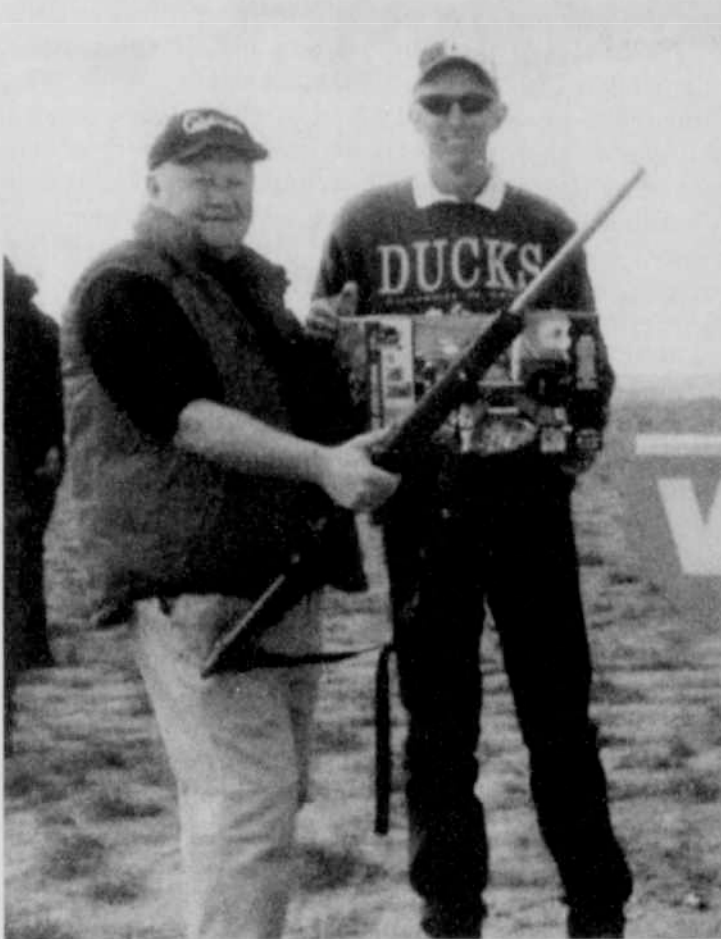

**Jepsen wins State OSAA Music Championship and Scholarship**

The month of May started off with three major music competition achievements for 16-year-old Amy Jepsen. Amy, who is a sophomore at Ione High School this year, represented the Ione School as the District 6 winner in both harp and piano at the annual Oregon School Activities Association (OSAA) Solo Music Championships. The state finals were held this year in Corvallis on the campus of Oregon State University on May 1.

There were 30 different instrumental and vocal solo categories with 441 music students representing 103 high schools participating in the event. There were three judges for each of the different music categories.

Amy took first place in the harp competition. Second place went to Nicole Chang of Catlin Gabel High School of Portland and third was Adrienne Fletcher of Forest Grove High School.

For the competition, Amy performed "Impromptu Caprice" by Gabriel Pierne. Her harp teacher is Denise Fujikawa of Portland. State solo winners were announced and medallions were awarded to the top three finishers at an awards ceremony that night at Milam Auditorium. Amy

was one of only five students to successfully defend the state music title she had won last year.

Jepsen also competed in the solo piano division, one of the largest and most intensely competitive events. Out of 26 state finalists, Amy finished in fifth place overall. First place in piano went to Nicholas Reynolds of Forest Grove High School. Nicholas and Amy both study piano with the same teacher, Shirley Brendlinger of Portland. Amy performed three different pieces in the piano competition: "Gardens in the Rain" by Debussy, "Prelude #10" by J.S. Bach, and "Etude #4, Opus 10" by Chopin.

Then on Monday, May 3, Amy performed on harp at the Monday Musical Club of Portland for their annual scholarship recital program. She was awarded \$850 in scholarship money that day. The Monday Musical Club divided up \$6,000 in prizes this year to nine vocal and instrumental performers. To win the scholarship money, Jepsen competed as one of 28 musicians, ages 16-22, in a Monday Musical Club Competition earlier in March and finished in second place. The recital and reception on May 3 were to honor the nine winners and award them their prize money. The other winners included pianists and vocalists from Portland State University, Linfield College, Portland, Corvallis, and Clackamas High Schools.

Amy is the daughter of Bill and Nancy Jepsen of Heppner. She has been studying piano for 10 years and harp for eight years.
