ODF announces regulated use closure in Northeast Oregon

On Saturday, Aug. 14, all lands protected by the Oregon Department of Forestry, Northeast Oregon District, were put into a Regulated Use Closure. The later moisture earlier this season delayed the restrictions that apply to regulated use, however hotter and drier weather normal for this time of year has prompted the following:

- Smoking is prohibited while traveling, except in vehicles on improved roads, in boats on the water, or at a cleared area.
- Open fires are prohibited, including campfires, charcoal fires, cooking fires and warming fires, except at designated locations. Portable cooling stoves using liquefied bottled fuel are allowed.
- Non-industrial chain saw use is prohibited, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 8 p.m. Chain saw use is permitted at all other hours, if the following fire fighting equipment is present with each operating saw: one axe, one shovel, and one operational eight oz. or larger fire extinguisher. In addition, a fire watch is required for at least one hour following the use of each chain saw.
- Use of motorized vehicles, including motorcycles and all-terrain vehicles, is prohibited, except on improved roads or for the commercial culture and harvest of agricultural crops.

-Possession of fire fighting equipment, which includes one axe, one shovel, and one gallon of water or one operational 2½ pound or larger fire extinguisher, are required when traveling on roads other than state or county roads.

-Use of fireworks and exploding targets are prohibited.

-Cutting, grinding and welding of metal is prohibited between the hours of 10 a.m. and 8 p.m. Cutting, grinding and welding can be done at all other times providing the activity is done in a cleared area with a water supply present.

-Mowing of dried and cured grass with power driven equipment is prohibited, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 8 p.m., except for the commercial culture and harvest of agricultural crops.

John Buckman, Acting District Forester for Northeast Oregon District, states, "Our highest occurrence for fires, both human and lightning caused happen during the latter part of August. Vacations and hunting bring campers to the forests that cause us concern. Fires usually started by smoking, off-road vehicles, and unattended campfires begin to crop up." Weather reports indicate drier conditions prompting the above restrictions.
