

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) reports handling the following business:

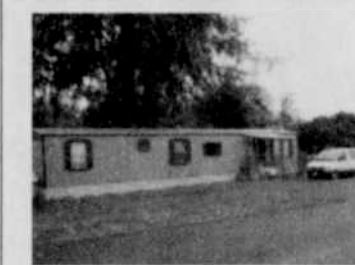
