**Ponies run past Stanfield**

A 27-0 lead at the half helped carry the Heppner Ponies past the Stanfield Tigers 34-14 on Friday, Sept. 24 in Stanfield. The Ponies improved to 2 and 0 on the year and will be at Pilot Rock on Friday, Oct. 8 at 3 p.m. for their next game.

The Ponies took the opening kick-off and moved the ball down the field eventually scoring on a Spencer Palmer 35-yard run, but it was called back by a penalty and they ended up turning the ball over on downs.

The next time they got the ball the Ponies didn't hurt themselves as Brent Eckman broke free around left end and need 70 yards down the sideline for a touchdown. The two-point conversion was no good, but the Ponies led 6-0 after one.

On Stanfield's next possession, Dalton Wellman picked off a Tiger pass at midfield, but the Ponies were unable to move the ball and were forced to punt.

Palmer ended the Tigers next drive with an interception of his own bringing it back to the Stanfield 47-yard line. Eckman broke free around right end this time setting two good downfield blocks from Bryan Holland in going untouched 53 yards for his second touchdown of the day. Palmer ran in the two-point conversion to make it 14-0.

The Ponies defense held forcing the Tigers to punt, which Palmer brought back 35 yards to the Tigers 36-yard line. Palmer then took a lateral pass from Eckman untouched to the end zone. Bryan Holland kicked the extra point to make it 21-0 late in the second quarter.

The Tigers drove inside Ponies territory before the defense held forcing a punt, which pinned Heppner back at their 15-yard line. On the last play of the half, Palmer broke free around right end and raced down the sideline 85 yards for a touchdown. The kick failed, but the Ponies held a 27-0 lead at the half.

The Ponies got their final touchdown in the third quarter when Chance Day got 32 yards on a reverse to set up a 37-yard touchdown run from Wellman. Holland's kick was good to make it 34-0.

Stanfield scored two touchdowns in the fourth, the last one with 10 seconds left to avoid the shutout.
