

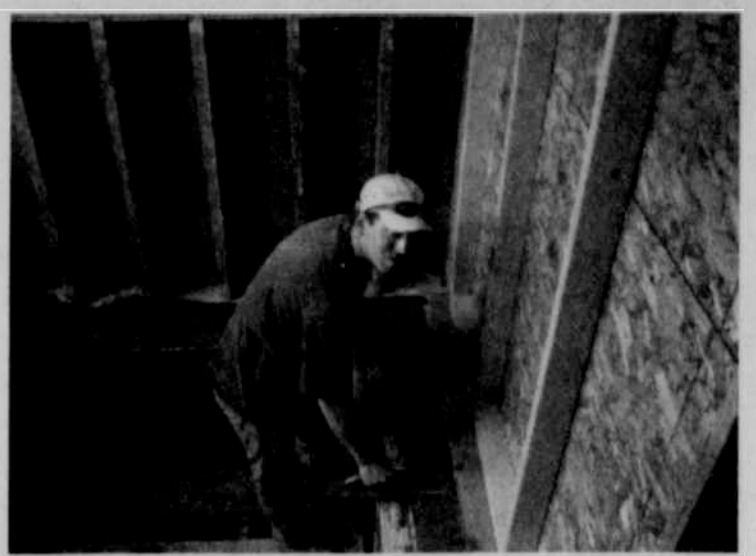
A look back at the year 2004

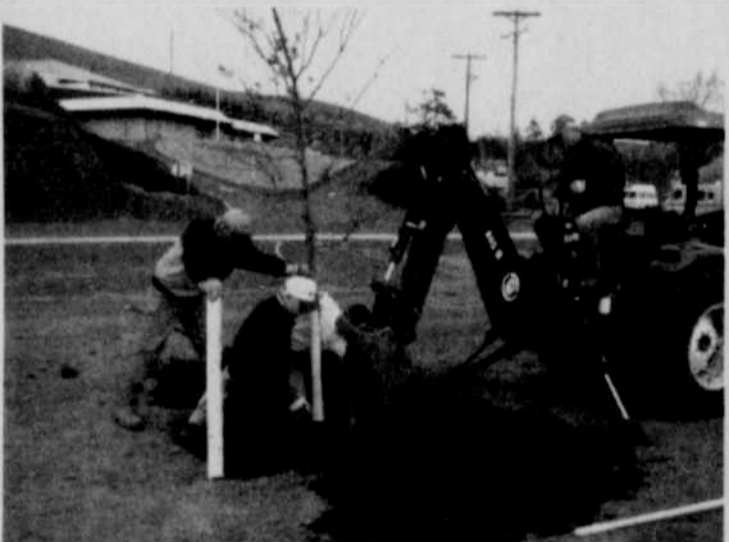

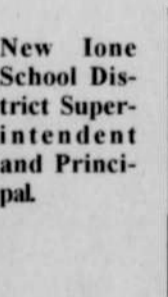

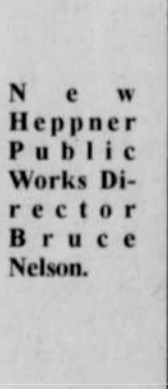
