**Mustang girls rally past Panthers**

After falling behind 11-2 midway through the first quarter, the Heppner Mustang varsity girls used a 15-3 advantage in the second quarter to rally past the Imbler Panthers, 57-32, on Tuesday, Dec. 28 in Imbler in non-league basketball game.

In winning their ninth straight game, the Mustangs improved to 9-1 on the year and will get back to Columbia Basin Conference play at Umatilla on Friday, Jan. 7 before returning home on Saturday, Jan. 8 to take on Sherman County.

Susan Southworth tied the game at 2-2 on a short jumper on a pass from Shanna Rietmann, but the Panthers scored nine straight before Rietmann scored off a rebound to make it 11-4. Southworth converted a three-point play and hit one of two free throws, but the Panthers still led 15-8 after one.

Lyndi Patton got a steal and lay-in and Linsey Mitchell hit two free throws to open the second and after a Panther basket, Rietmann scored off a pass from Blair Keithley. Terra Wilson hit a jumper and three of four free throws and Southworth hit a running jumper to give the Mustangs a 21-17 lead. Regi Seitz hit a lay-in on a pass from Wilson at the buzzer to make it 23-18 at the half.

After a Panther bucket to open the third, Megan Orr scored off a pass

from Sarah Price then scored off a steal to make it 27-20. Orr scored six straight and Seitz hit two free throws as the Mustangs took a 35-24 lead after three.

Lyndi Patton and Southworth scored to open the fourth, then Orr scored four straight, Heather Yocom scored off a rebound and Mitchell hit one of two free throws to make it 46-24. The Panthers came back with seven straight, but Lynan Bingham converted a three-point play and Wilson made two free throws to make the final score 51-32.

Orr led the way with 14 points, nine rebounds and five steals with Southworth adding 10 points. Wilson had seven points, Rietmann had six assists, Mitchell had four rebounds and two steals and Patton had four steals.

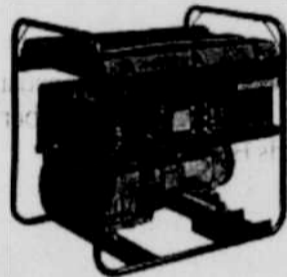

**Plug In Safely!**



Never connect a generator directly to your home's internal wiring. The electrical "backfeed" can injure or kill utility workers repairing power lines. For safety's sake, hire a licensed electrician to install a transfer switch that distributes power from the generator to the home's circuit box. The transfer switch is installed beside the main electrical panel and is connected to circuits you will need during an outage. When the power goes out, you simply crank up the generator and run a single extension cord from it to the transfer switch. Once the generator is running, you can choose which circuits you want to use by flipping the switches on the transfer switch. It is important to keep track of what is being powered, because the transfer switch is often wired into more circuits than the generator can handle all at once.
