

## Mustangs lose to Pendleton JV

After having Grant Union cancel out of Friday's game and having the doubleheader at Warrenton rained out, the Heppner Mustang baseball team was able to get a game up with the Pendleton JV at the last minute, but came out flat and never got going as they lost 7-1 in Pendleton on Saturday, April 2. The Mustangs, 2 and 2, have rescheduled the doubleheader with Sherman County, which was snowed out, for Thursday, April 7 at Moro at 3 p.m. and will be at home against Nyssa for a doubleheader on Saturday, April 9 beginning at 1 p.m. The Mustangs start the Columbia Basin Conference season at Weston-McEwen on Tuesday, April 12 for one game at 4:30 p.m.

The Bucks took a 1-0 lead in the second and stretched it to 5-0 in the fourth, before the Mustangs

could get on the board. Jode Coil doubled, went to third on a single by Josh Gutierrez and scored on a Kory Paullus fielder's choice. Pendleton added two more in the bottom of the fifth for the final score of 7-1.

Coil pitched four innings striking out six, giving up two hits, no walks, but hit four batters. Gutierrez went the last two innings in relief, giving up two runs.

Matt Kenny got the only other hit as the Mustangs could manage just three for the game.

## Mustang JVs outlast Hermiston Frosh

After building leads of 14-2 going into the bottom of the fifth and 16-6 going in to the sixth, the Heppner Mustang JV baseball team outlasted the Hermiston Bulldog Frosh and took a 16-13 win on Monday, March 28 in Hermiston. The Mustangs hurt themselves by giving up 14 walks and hit seven batters, but they gave up just six hits and had just one error.

With two out in the first, the Mustangs got on the board when Matt McCabe singled and scored on a Matt Kenny double. Kenny later scored when Nacho Elguezabal reached on an error.

The Bulldogs tied it in second, but the Mustangs came back in the third when McCabe was hit by a pitch, Kenny reached on an error and Elguezabal grounded out to second to score McCabe. Robbie Smith then had an RBI single, Colton Hanson walked, Andre Rauch had an RBI single and Hanson scored on a wild pitch to make it 6-2.

In the fourth, Nathan Kennedy, McCabe and Kenny each walked, Elguezabal scored two with a single, Smith singled, Kenny scored on a wild pitch and Rauch grounded out to score Elguezabal and make it 10-2.

They added four

more in the fifth when Cody Hollis struck out, but reached on an error by the catcher. Kennedy walked, McCabe had an RBI single, Smith walked and all three ended up scoring on wild pitches to make it 14-2.

The Bulldogs scored four in the bottom half, but the Mustangs came back with two more in the sixth when McCabe was hit by a pitch, Elguezabal singled, Smith had a two-out RBI single and Elguezabal eventually scored on a wild pitch to make it 16-6.

The Bulldogs came back with four in the bottom half to make it 16-10, then scored three in the seventh and had the bases loaded with no outs when Hollis came in to get a strikeout and a double play to end the game.

Smith went three for four with two RBI. McCabe went two for two and scored five runs. Elguezabal went two for five and had three RBI and Kenny went two for four and scored three runs.

The Mustangs were ahead 4-2 when the second game was called after three innings due to darkness. The Mustangs, 4 and 0, will be at home against Riverside for a doubleheader on Thursday, April 14 at 3:30 p.m.

The Mustangs jumped out to a quick lead in the first when Kennedy reached on an error, McCabe walked and Matt Kenny reached on an error to score Kennedy. McCabe scored on a wild pitch as Nacho Elguezabal and Robbie Smith walked. Colton Hanson scored two with a double and Smith and Hanson scored on wild pitches as Andre Rauch walked to make it 6-0.
