

## Mustangs beat Tigerscots

The Heppner Mustang baseball team took advantage of 12 Weston-McEwen errors to beat the Tigerscots 10-6 on Thursday, April 14 in Athena to open the Columbia Basin Conference season. The game was originally scheduled for Tuesday but it had to be delayed due to a rain and hail storm shortly before game time that made the field unplayable.

The Mustangs, 1-0 in the CBC and 7-2 overall, will be at Stanfield for a crucial doubleheader on Friday, April 22 and at home for another important CBC game against Pilot Rock on Tuesday, April 26 at 4:30 p.m.

The Mustangs got on the board in the second inning when Nick Christman and Quinn Peck reached on errors, Dan Basile scored them with a double, then Kyle Carlson and Jode Coil each had two-out RBI singles to make it 4-0.

They added another run in the third when Christman again reached on an error, went to second on a Basile single and scored on a Nacho Elguezabal single but the Tigerscots came back with five runs in the bottom half to tie it at 5-5.

The Mustangs took the lead for good in the

fourth when Coil singled, stole second and scored as Kory Paullus reached on an error. Christman and Peck walked, Paullus scored on a wild pitch and Basile had an RBI single.

They made it 10-5 in the fifth when Matt McCabe reached on an error, stole second and scored on two more throwing errors. Coil hit a bloop double and scored as Josh Gutierrez reached on an error.

The Tigerscots added a run in the seventh, but the lead was never threatened.

Gutierrez came on in relief in the fourth pitching two scoreless innings to pick up the win, with Coil coming in for the sixth and seventh to pick-up the save.

Basile was three for four with three RBI. Coil was three for five, scoring twice and Christman scored three runs.

Senior pitchers Josh Gutierrez and Jode Coil combined for 25 strikeouts, three walks, three hit batters and just two runs in 14 innings to help the Heppner Mustang baseball team to a 6-2, 3-0 sweep of the visiting Umatilla Vikings in Columbia Basin Conference play on Saturday, April 16. The Mustangs, 3-0 in the CBC and 9-2 overall, will be at Stanfield for a critical CBC doubleheader on Friday, April 22 beginning at 11 a.m. before being at home for another important league game against Pilot Rock on Tuesday, April 26 at 4:30 p.m.

The Vikings took an early lead in the top of the first in the first game but the Mustangs came back in the bottom of the second. The come back was seen when Quinn Peck, Matt McCabe and Sloan Keithley walked, Peck scored on a wild pitch, Coil was hit by a pitch, Gutierrez reached on an error to score McCabe, Kory Paullus was hit by a pitch to force in a run and Nacho Elguezabal walked to force in another run to give them a 4-1 lead.

The Mustangs added another run in the fourth when Gutierrez hit a high fly ball that carried over the fence in right field for a home run.

The Vikings came back with a run in the fifth but the Mustangs answered with one in the sixth when Coil reached on an error, Gutierrez singled and Coil scored as Paullus reached on an error.

Gutierrez went the distance striking out 14 batters, no walks, scattering six hits to pick up the win.

Gutierrez went two for four with a home run, Paullus had two RBI, Coil scored twice and McCabe walked three times.

In the night cap, Coil would get all the runs he would need in the third inning when Matt Kenny and Coil singled and Paullus hit a long homerun to left-center for a 3-0 lead.

Coil made it stand up as he finished with a no-hitter, striking out 11, walking three and hit one for a complete game win.

Paullus went two for three with the homerun and three RBI and Kenny and McCabe each went one for two.

The Mustangs got all the runs they would need in the third inning when Matt Kenny was hit by a pitch, sacrificed to second by Carlson and scored on an single by Josh Gutierrez.

Carlson struck out five, walked two and hit one in his seven innings of work.

Paullus and Peck each went two for three with McCabe going one for three with an RBI.

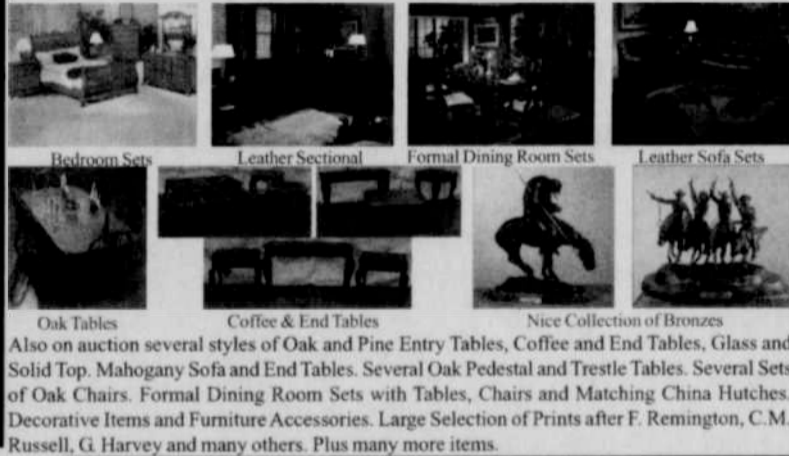
