Fourth of July poster contest announced

Paper must be white 12x18, but aside from that, the artist's imagination may go in any direction. Any patriotic theme is appropriate, or the creator may stay with the overall theme of the celebration, which is "Red, White and Blues... Cruisin' to the Blues".

The finished posters are due to the Bank of EO in either Ione or Heppner by noon on Friday, July 1.

Winners will be posted in the windows of the bank in Ione by Sunday, July 3. Entrants must be sure to put their full name, address, phone number and age group on the back of the poster.

Age groups (the year just completed in school) are: Pre-school-Kindergarten; Grades 1-2; Grades 3-4-5; Grades 6-7-8; High School and Adult. Prizes are: 1st-\$20; 2nd-\$17.50; 3rd-\$15; 4th-\$12.50 in each age group. All entries who do not win a cash prize will receive a \$5 gift certificate to be redeemed at Collier's Market or Sunflower Junction by July 31.

Any producer unable to attend the public meeting may submit written comments to Tammy Dennee, Administrator, Oregon Grains Commission, P.O. Box 1086, Pendleton, OR 97801; on or before Monday, June 27.

Commission meetings are open to the public, and anyone wishing to participate is encouraged to do so. The meeting location is accessible to persons with disabilities.
