Tree guide book available

"What Tree Is That?", a pocket guide for identifying trees, is available from The National Arbor Day Foundation.

The 84-page guide will help you identify 157 different trees found in the western U.S.

Well-known trees are included: oaks, maples, firs, and pines. Also species such as golden chinquapin and peachleaf willow, redbuds and red cedar, sycamore and salt cedar and sequoia and spruce.

Dozens of drawings illustrate the trees' leaves or needles and their acorns, berries, seed pods, cones, and other identifying features. "What Tree Is That?" is organized to make it easy to identify trees in a simple step-by-step fashion.

"Helping people enjoy and appreciate trees is central to the educational mission of the Arbor Day Foundation," John Rosenow, the foundation's president, said. "Being able to identify trees is important to knowing how to care for them and how to plant the right tree in the right place."

HOBY is a seminar that takes leaders from many Oregon towns and cities and puts them in a unique learning experience. These seminars happen all over the world. Actor Hugh O'Brien established HOBY after returning from Africa in 1958 inspired by his visit with humanitarian, Dr. Albert Schweitzer. Later that year, while portraying the legendary lawman, Wyatt Earp, on television, O'Brien decided to make his own contribution to society by establishing HOBY. Since that time, HOBY has motivated tens of thousands of young people to realize their leadership potential by conducting annual seminars on a variety of subjects which focus around the theme of "Motivating Tomorrow's Leaders Today."

"What I got out of this seminar was that my dreams and goals can happen with hard work and dedication," said Mahaley. "I can also help others and my community with my leadership skills. Not only was HOBY a great learning experience for me, but I also met a lot of amazing people that made a difference in my life," she said.

"The last day of HOBY was sad," added Mahaley, "but there was also a major highlight. Hugh O'Brien, the man who created HOBY and an actor who played in the series "Wyatt Earp", talked to us from cell phone. It was really neat. You could hear how much he cared about this program and what it did for us."

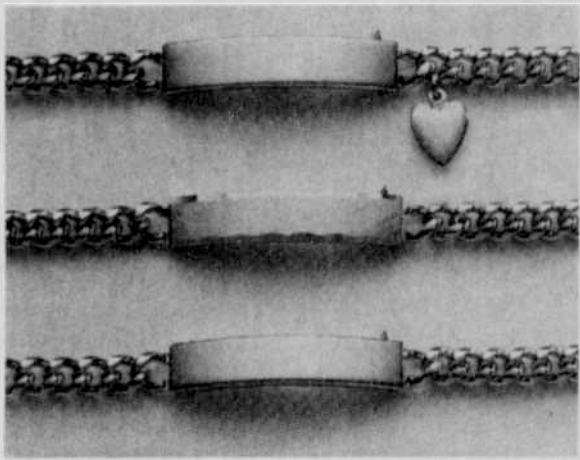

Everyone is invited to attend.



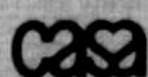

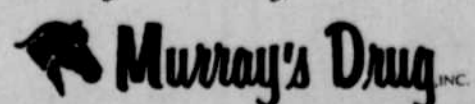
